ADB Safeguards Policy Statement, 2009: Scope and Architecture



- Approved July 2009, effective March 2010
- Scope: 3 main policy areas: Environment, Involuntary Resettlement (IR), and Indigenous Peoples (IP)

Architecture:

- One umbrella policy statement. 3 sets of policy principles.
- Borrower requirements for each of the 3 policy areas (Appendices 1-3)
- Requirements for different finance modalities e.g. sector loans, emergency assistance, policy-based lending, financial intermediaries, corporate finance. No coverage of results-based lending (Appendix 4)
- Prohibited Investment Activities List (Appendix 5)
- Strengthening and Use of Country Safeguard Systems (Appendix 6)

Stakeholder Engagement, Grievance Redress Mechanism and Information Disclosure under SPS (2009): Overview



Meaningful consultation

- SPS paras 54-55 requires consultation with "communities, groups, or people affected by proposed projects, and with civil society" and indigenous communities (IPs)
- SRI, 2 and 3 text slightly different, but requires consultation with affected people, indigenous communities, host communities, and concerned nongovernment organizations
 - Begins and is carried out throughout the project cycle;
 - Provides timely disclosure of relevant and adequate information to affected people;
 - Is undertaken in an atmosphere free of intimidation or coercion;
 - Is gender inclusive and responsive, tailored to the needs of vulnerable groups;
 - Enables the incorporation of all relevant views into decision making.
- Grievance redress mechanism scaled to the risks and adverse impacts of the project.
 - Address affected people's complaints promptly,
 - Using an understandable and transparent process
 - Be gender responsive, culturally appropriate, readily accessible at no costs and without retribution.

Stakeholder Engagement, Grievance Redress Mechanism and Information Disclosure under SPS (2009): Overview cont.



- Disclosure of a draft environmental assessment, IR and IP frameworks and plans in a timely manner
 - before project appraisal, in an accessible place and in a form and language(s) understandable to stakeholders.
 - a draft full EIA at least 120 days prior to ADB Board consideration, and/or environmental assessment and review frameworks before project appraisal
- **Disclosure of monitoring reports** and relevant information from monitoring reports to affected people.
- If the provision of **broad community support** (BCS) for IP safeguards triggers, ADB will assure itself that BCS for the project has been demonstrated by the IP communities.

Independent Evaluation Department: Findings for Stakeholder Engagement, Information Disclosure and Grievance Redress Mechanism

Project Implementation

- Weaknesses in stakeholder engagement, meaningful consultation, timely disclosure, and functioning of project level GRM.
- Client confidentiality clauses influenced low disclosure for non-sovereign operations

• SPS (2009)

- Limited guidance in SPS on how to make consultations and GRMs effective and how to monitor effectiveness.
- Disclosure requirement of 120 days EIA for category A projects is not aligned with other MFIs.

Independent Evaluation Department: Findings for Stakeholder Engagement, Information Disclosure and Grievance Redress Mechanism

- Adopt an integrated approach covering environmental and social dimensions.
- Develop separate policy standard for stakeholder engagement, with provisions aligned with the recently updated MFI safeguard frameworks.
- Adopt stakeholder engagement plan (SEP) as best practice safeguards instrument;
- Consider shorter disclosure requirements, particularly for non-sovereign operations.
- Improve guidance and systematic training to staff, borrowers and clients was emphasized.

 Study objective is to provide informed recommendations for the development of a policy standard on SEID and GRM

Analytical Study Methodology

- Desk based document review IED Report and ADB Management Response; cases under Accountability Mechanism Policy Review, Draft ADB Study on Grievance Redress Mechanism implementation
- Benchmarking with other MFI polices Comparative analysis with IDB, IDB Invest, EBRD, WB,
 IFC latest safeguards policies and guidance documents
- Stakeholder consultations and workshops ADB staff, including technical working group, developing member countries, Private Sector clients and organizations, civil society organisations.

Scope and Application





SPS (2009)

Other MFIs

Aims, Objectives, Scope of Application scattered in different safeguards requirements and embedded in SPS	Different SEID policy requirements pulled together into one Standard
No specific SEP required	SEP required proportionate to nature & scale of the project
Environment and Social synergies not clearly covered	Integrate environment and social dimensions

Information disclosure requirements varied. Information disclosure guidance across SPS, Access to Information Policy, & Project Administration Manual (PAM) Draft EIA for Category A to be disclosed at least 120 days before Board consideration	Information disclosure varied with further details on type of information required Information disclosure guidance in one standard and Access to Information Policies Draft ESIA disclosure requirement 60-120 days depending on private/public sectors
Full website disclosure required for resettlement documentation	

Grievance Redress Mechanism





SPS (2009)

Other MFIs

Policy does not distinguish formal and informal mechanisms	Use of suitable existing formal and informal grievance mechanisms
Anonymous complaints are not mentioned in the policy document	Anonymous complaints are specifically mentioned
Guidance is spread out in different guidance materials	More guidance on the establishment, implementation and monitoring of the GRM in the policy

Key SEID issues for further consideration (Part I)



A stand-alone SEID policy standard

• to align with other MFI safeguard frameworks, consider overlaps with cross-cutting and thematic areas; provide clearer provisions on stakeholder engagement, documentation, disclosure and GRM requirements for sovereign and non-sovereign operations.

Preparation of a stakeholder engagement plan (SEP)

- proportionate to the nature and scale of the project and its potential risks and impacts
- stakeholder identification; information disclosure and communication; project GRMs; monitoring system; stakeholder roles and responsibilities, budget and training.

Information disclosure

- aligning with other MFIs for sovereign and non-sovereign operations,
- strengthening continuous disclosure to project affected people.

Key SEID issues for further consideration (Part 2)



Grievance Redress Mechanisms included in the SEID policy standard

• Customized in a culturally appropriate way for different types of affected people; where possible, utilize acceptable and traditional dispute resolution methods, considers anonymous complaints.

Monitoring

- Clarifying requirements for Client/Borrower monitoring of SEP implementation (including GRM), updates in processes and approaches as appropriate;
- Strengthen ADB's safeguard oversight and resources for monitoring safeguards implementation.

Guidance materials:

• Updated and improved guidance, toolkits, templates and good practice notes both for sovereign and non-sovereign operations.
