






What is the Atoll Climate Youth Project?

- ADB Youth for Asia (YfA), with the support from the Ireland Climate Resilience Fund is implementing "Catalyzing Youth-Led Climate Action in Atoll Nations"
- The project will cover Kiribati, Maldives, Marshall Islands, and Tuvalu
- The project aims to equip and empower young people in the Atoll Nations to lead climate action at the local, national, and regional levels

What is the Atoll Youth Climate Leaders program?



Atoll Youth Climate Leaders (AYCL)

- Serve as Official Ambassadors of ADB Youth for Asia for climate action
- Lead on-the-ground activities for ADB YfA's project in one of the Atoll Countries (Kiribati, Tuvalu, Marshall Islands, and the Maldives)
- Represent ADB YfA's project in a significant event such as the Intergenerational Climate Dialogue with Governments and other stakeholders





What are we looking for in AYCL?

- Young people who are 18-30 years old (inclusive) from the Atoll Countries
- Leadership capability such as working well in a team, initiative, and good communication skills
- Passionate about climate change and youth development
- Experiences in community engagement activities, facilitation, and data collection, or willing to learn and gain these experiences







Applying as Atoll Youth Climate Leaders



How can I apply as an AYCL?

- If you have trouble submitting online, you can also request assistance from our local organization partners: KiriCAN (Kiribati), Dhivehi Masverin (Maldives), TuCAN (Tuvalu), and MIYSC (Marshall Islands)
- You can either print your forms, fill them offline, take photos, and submit them to the local organization in your respective countries.

What are the benefits of an AYCL?

- You will be working with our Global team at ADB YfA to implement the Atoll Youth Climate Project!
- You will receive:
 - Daily allowance US\$30/day, communication, and transportation supports for 50 days of working during February October 2022
 - Series of training on Climate Change, Climate Risk Data Collection, Ethics and Safeguarding in Research
 - Participation in Climate Innovation and Capacity Building in Project Development, and Management
 - Opportunity to represent ADB YfA's project in the Our Ocean Conference 2022 in Palau
 - Recognition from Asian Development Bank's YfA Program



What are the main activities that I need to lead/be involved with?

Youth-led Climate Risk Assessment

You will facilitate data collection activities with a group of young people to understand about the impact of climate change towards them



Climate Change Innovation and Capacity Building

You will help organize logistics, and coordination for the implementation of capacity building in each of the Atoll Countries



Climate Project Demonstration

There will be selected at least 10 projects from four Atoll Countries (2-3 projects/country). You will work with project leaders, and ensure the projects achieve positive impacts



Intergenerational Climate Dialogue

You will organize logistics and coordination with governments, NGOs, CSOs, etc. You will also have the opportunity to participate in Our Ocean Conference 2022 in Palau.





Wait, I'm working from February-October 2022, but the allowance is only for 50 days?

Correct! - You will only work intermittently with us during activities such as climate risk data collection, capacity building programs, intergenerational climate dialogue, etc... You will not be working the whole time, so you can do anything else such as continue your study (if you're still studying) or working. But you need to commit until the end of the project activities in October 2022.
