





ADB Procurement Framework – Key documents



The ADB procurement framework consists of the *ADB Procurement Policy* (the Policy), the *Procurement Regulations for ADB Borrowers* (the Regulations), the *Staff Instructions* (SI), and associated *guidance notes* (GN).

(i) **ADB Procurement Policy:** Approved by ADB Board of Directors, the Policy specifies ADB's six core procurement principles and various considerations relevant to their implementation in ADB financed operations.


(ii) **The Regulations:** Approved by ADB Management, the Regulations provide choices for Borrowers to allow them to determine the most appropriate procurement method, specify the rules that must be followed and set out ADB's procurement due diligence function.

(iii) **The Staff Instructions:** Approved by the Procurement, Portfolio and Financial Management Department (PPFD) Staff Instructions define the roles and responsibilities of ADB staff in implementing the Policy and Regulations, including the procurement decision authorities and service standards. They also set out the procurement procedures and practices to be applied by ADB Borrowers.


(iv) **The Guidance Notes:** Approved by PPFD provide more details to ADB Borrowers to give best practice advice and assist them in implementing various procurement methods and modalities.

Core Procurement Principles

- i) economy
- (ii) efficiency

Fitness for purpose

Fitness for purpose requires procurement arrangements to appropriately reflect the strategic needs and circumstances of the situation. In case a standardized approach cannot effectively and efficiently meet project outcomes and development objectives, including in capacity-constrained environments, a customized approach may be adopted, entailing transaction-specific methods and documentation.

Eligibility

Except in any case in which the Board of Directors determines otherwise, (i) loans or grants from Special Funds resources can be used only for procurement of goods, works, and services produced in, and supplied from, developed member countries that have contributed to such resources or developing member countries; and (ii) loans or grants from ADB's ordinary capital resources or ADB-administered funds can be used only for procurement of goods, works, and services produced in, and supplied from, member countries.

Alternative Procurement Arrangements

- ADB may agree to (i) apply the procurement rules and procedures of another multilateral or bilateral agency or organization involved in the project, and may agree to such a party taking a leading role in providing implementation support and monitoring project procurement activities; or (ii) rely on the procurement rules and procedures applied by an agency or entity of the borrower accredited by ADB, provided that in each case such arrangements are (a) compatible with the value, risk, or complexity of the procurement; (b) consistent with the Core Procurement Principles; and that (c) unless waived, ADB's member country eligibility restrictions continue to apply; and (d) ADB's Anticorruption Guidelines and contractual remedies in applicable financing agreements with the borrower continue to apply.

Roles and Responsibilities of ADB

- The borrower prepares the procurement plan that is agreed by ADB. The borrower is legally responsible and accountable for the procurement. It invites, receives, and evaluates bids, and awards the contract. The contract is between the borrower and the supplier, service provider, or contractor; ADB is not a party to the contract. The responsibility for the implementation of the project, and therefore for the payment of goods, works, and services under the project, rests solely with the borrower.

Asian Development Bank Review

ADB reviews the borrower's procurement procedures, documents, bid evaluations, award recommendations, and contracts under a risk-based approach through prior and post review (sampling) to ensure that the procurement process is carried out in accordance with the agreed procedures.

ADB **may**, where necessary, **provide extended support without however diminishing the responsibility of the borrower for the execution of the procurement** or becoming involved in the procurement decision-making process (or a part thereof).

Bidder's role

- The bidder should then critically review the bidding documents to see if there is any ambiguity, omission, or internal contradiction, or any feature of specifications, terms of reference, or other conditions which are unclear or appear discriminatory or restrictive. In such case, the bidder should seek clarification from the borrower, in writing, within the time period specified in the bidding documents for seeking clarifications.
- The criteria and methodology for selection of the successful bidder are outlined in the bidding documents. If these are not clear, clarification should be similarly sought from the borrower.

Bidder's responsibility

- The specific bidding documents issued by the borrower govern each procurement transaction. If a bidder concludes that any of the provisions in the bidding documents are inconsistent with these Regulations, it should also raise such issue with the borrower.
- It is the responsibility of the bidder to raise any issue of ambiguity, contradiction, omission, etc., prior to the submission of its bid to assure submission of a fully responsive and compliant bid that includes all the supporting documents requested in the bidding documents.

Bidder's responsibility

- Noncompliance with critical requirements (technical and commercial) will result in rejection of the bid. If a bidder wishes to propose deviations to a noncritical requirement, or propose an alternative solution, the bidder should quote the price for the fully compliant bid and then separately indicate the adjustment in price that can be offered if the deviation is accepted. Alternative solutions should be offered only when authorized in the bidding documents.
- Once bids are received and publicly opened, bidders will not be required or permitted to change the price or substance of a bid.

The Operational Procurement Statistics Dashboard (ProcDash) presents the value of all goods, works and consulting services contracts awarded for projects under the Asian Development Bank operations. It has four sections, namely, overview, operational procurement by nationality, operational procurement by origin of goods and services, and operational procurement by threshold. For purposes of this dashboard, **value of operational procurement is reported in terms of the amount financed by ADB.**

The overview section presented below shows data on operational procurement statistics by region, nature, sector and by borrowing country. Data can be further filtered by contract year and modality. To determine the allocated procurement for policy-based support and results-based lending, click these two items in the modality filter.









The Ulaanbaatar Green Affordable Housing and Resilient Urban Renewal Project (AHURP) aims to bridge current gaps in climate responsive urban development and green affordable housing in support of redeveloping Ulaanbaatar's informally settled ger areas.
