- Transport is the largest sector for ADB (lending volume)
- Aligned with the Climate Agenda (main contributor)
- Unprecedented transport infrastructure growth in Asia in last decade
- Infrastructure gap in Asia
- New Megaprojects. Southeast Asia
- Upstream dialogue and integrated approach
- Value addition, innovation, knowledge and partnerships



# Transport Sector - Key messages

- Sub-sector focus:
  - Roads still important (Resilient, Regional connectivity, Asset Management, Road Safety)
  - Rail (National rail systems, operations, logistics and institutions)
  - Urban transport (metro, bus, active modes, e-mobility)
  - Emerging modes (new mobilities, cable solutions)
  - Maritime and aviation
- Changing demands from clients:
  - Integrated and system approach
  - Efficiency gains
  - Value addition
- Incorporate new technologies and applications:
  - Systems management
  - Use of data (operators and users)
  - Emerging technologies (e-vehicles, advanced digital technologies)
- Increased attention to private sector support
- Broader use of financial services to meet demands
