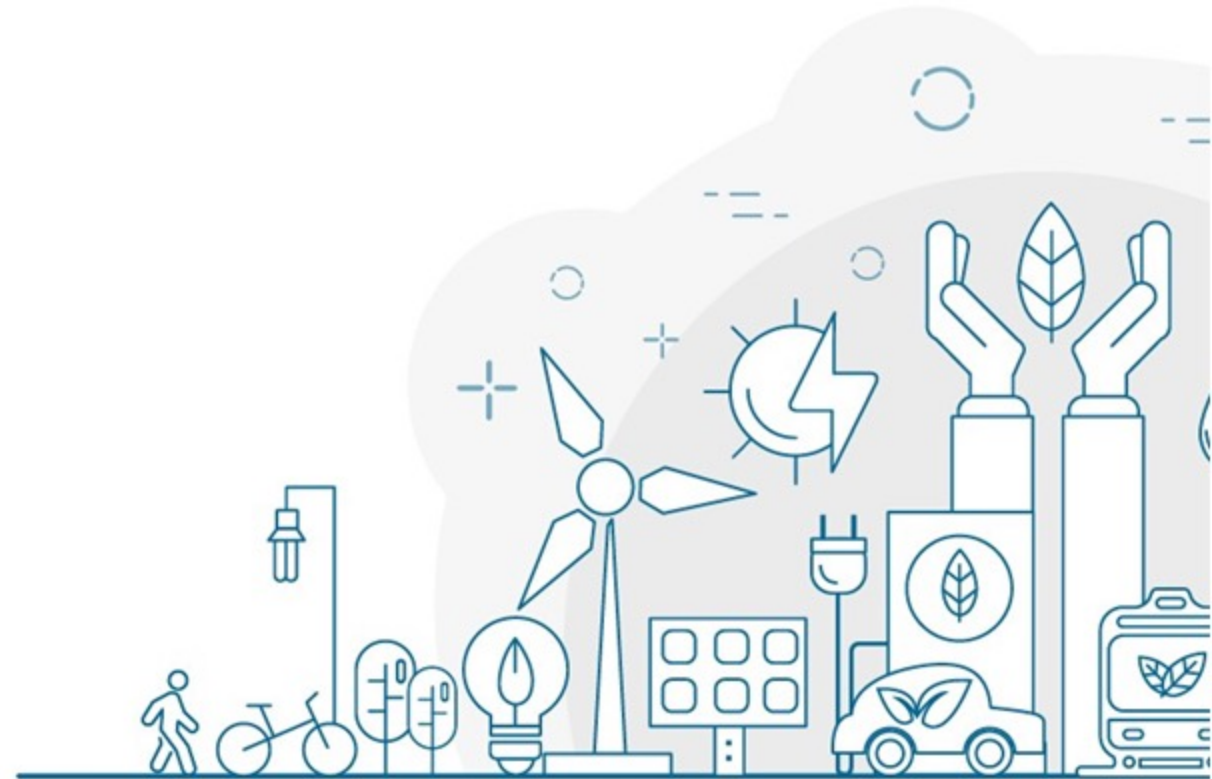

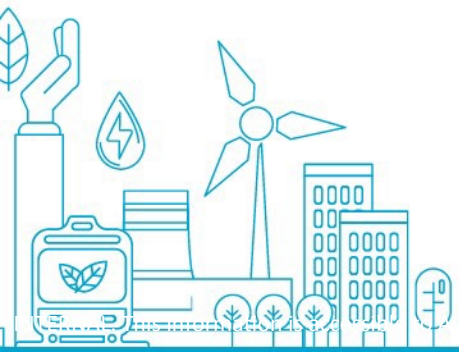

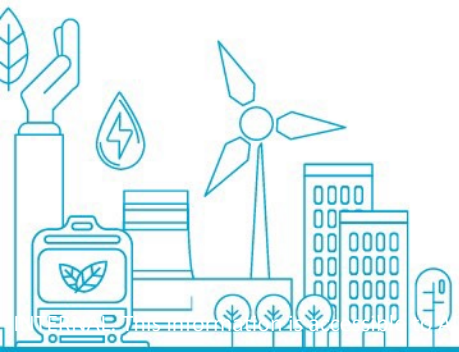

# Three Key insights or lesson learnt

- Importance to identify key risk through stakeholder consultation and updating the risk assessment throughout the project cycle.
- Different category of risk to be considered in the RAMP
- Difference between facts, risk and uncertainty
- Not to underestimate or overestimate the risk.



# Actions to manage the project risk

- Develop detailed project level RAMP
- Strengthen stakeholder consultation
- Adjust mitigation through regular project review to check risk and mitigation measures.
