The ADB Board of Directors approved the ESF on 22 November 2024

Expected to become effective on 1 January 2026 for projects without an approved concept note


One risk classification per project, compared to three in the SPS (for environment, involuntary resettlement, and Indigenous Peoples)

SPS categories mapped to ESF classifications:

Cat A (=High);

Cat B (=Substantial or Moderate);

Cat C (= Low)



For Financial Intermediary transactions, the risk classification assigned is FI, with sub classifications of FI-1, FI-2 and FI-3 based on the risk of the expected transactions/activities to be financed by ADB




