- This makes India home to one in every five children under six worldwide.
- The scale and success of India's childcare policies have global implications — not only for child development, but also for gender equality, maternal employment, and social equity.

Koosina Mane: A Local Solution to a Global Challenge

- In rural India, lack of access to structured childcare services limits the participation of women in paid work.
- The Koosina Mane program by the Government of Karnataka responds to this gap by offering creche services for children of informal women workers.
- With a gender-responsive, local government-anchored model, the program aims to:
 - Reduce the unpaid care burden on rural women
 - Improve early childhood outcomes
 - Enable economic mobility for mothers
 - To develop a new service sector of care entrepreneurship

A Convergent Model for Childcare

Delivering childcare by pooling resources and responsibilities across departments

<u>GP</u>: Set up of infrastructure, provision of food and overall operations

WCD: Child's Growth Monitoring, Immunisation and Monitoring the Creche workers

NREGA: Payment of wages to the caretakers

Why Convergence Matters

- Holistic child care Infrastructure + Nutrition + Health + Trained caregivers
- Efficient use of public funds Departments share the load
- Better service delivery Combines local presence, health systems, and wage security
- Empowers local governments Panchayats play a central role in implementation
