History

- Bayanijuan sa Southville 7 in Calauan Laguna is the official relocation site of Kapitbisig para sa llog Pasig for Informal Settlers affected by the Pasig River Rehailitation
- The 107 hectare property is owned by the National Housing Authority which signed a 10 year co-management agreement with ABS-CBN Foundation Inc. (AFI)







 AFI harnessed the private sector to augment the existing infrastructure/resources of NHA and to built up the site.

First Balfour/Lopez Group rebuilt the School and constructed Livelihood and training centers, and basketball court





San Miguel Corporation and Sunlife donated houses

Organization of Homeowners Association

- 9 Homeowners' Associations have been formed ;
- As a first project, the HOAs established communal part of their waste management system
- conducted a 6-month daily community feeding program for the 35 most needy families in their respective areas in exchange for community service





• An ADB grant from the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction with NHA as executing agency and AFI as implementor fills the gaps in the current partnership. The grant looks at BNJS7 as a pilot for Public-Private Partnerships in poor communities. The grant aims to document best practices for future replication.







• Full electrification is expected to be obtained enabling the set up of locators and other places of employment.



• A chapel, sports field (AFI), transport terminal, commercial centers (by NHA), e-trikes (ADB) are programmed.







 At the end of the three year period, the BNJ comunity is expected to be fully integrated into the municipality of Calauan, including its planning and governance, and is part of the IRA of the municipality;

A model for a relocation community would have also been developed and is ready for replication.
