


ADB Asia's overall infrastructure scores* is relatively low

- AAA credit rating helps mobilize funds for development activities



Sovereign and Non sovereignADBApprovals (in \$ million)








Approvals by Modality (in \$ million)






2013 Active Portfolio - \$65.1 billion by Department






