Farmers' Forum (FaFo) - what is it?

- Consultation and dialogue among small farmers' and rural producers' organizations, IFAD and governments;
- Engagement with rural organizations at field level, and dialogue at regional and international levels;
- FaFo meets every two years for global consultation, in conjunction with IFAD's Governing Council;
- Fifth global FaFo meeting (2014) with more than 80 farmers' leaders representing millions of smallholders and rural producers from all over the world;
- Special sessions: Women (2010), Youth (2012), Small-scale fisheries (2014).



FaFo Special Session on Women in 2010

- Economic empowerment and access to assets
- Capacity-building and training
- Quotas for women's participation
- Culture and institutional change
- Supportive networks, fora and other structures
- Positive media messages and portrayals of women
- Funding of women's organizations or women's structures within farmers' organizations





IFAD Farmers' Forum

After eight years, the FAFO changed the way IFAD and FOs work together

Partnerships evolving around specific opportunities (e.g. country-level partnership, support to advocacy campaigns)

Pragmatic and opportunistic approach but fragile

- Organic farmer for 16 years.
- Chair of Board of Directors, Araneta Farmers Agrarian Reform Beneficiaries MPC last year
- Leader of 50 organic farmers from three farmer organizations
- Accessed approximately Php 4 Million for Organic Rice Project

Rural Women's Leadership Programme – some conclusions

- Support from family is crucial for women's leadership cultural change
- Demand from women, especially at the grass-roots level, to have their priorities heard in farmers' organizations
- Mobilizing women leaders at the grassroots level requires a holistic approach
- Training enables women to do well





Rural Women's Leadership Programme

Creating institutional space for women takes time – long term support is needed Gender strategies are a good entry point Evaluate benefits of women- only groups and mixed groups
