Human Security in Practice: East Asian Experiences Collaboration with ASEAN+3 researchers

Exploring the way to further operationalize the idea of human security by identifying good practices in East Asia (i.e. ASEAN +3)

Phase 1 (Nov. 2013 – Mar. 2015)

Inquiring into various stakeholders' **understanding of the concept** of human security as well as their **perceptions of threats** to human security in each country and the region.

 \rightarrow 9 JICA-RI Working Papers published (as of Mar. 2015)

Phase 2: (Apr. 2015 – Oct. 2016)

Case studies to address 3 questions: (1) how to deal with **national sovereignty** when pressing needs arise, (2) how to provide **comprehensive** support, (3) how to promote **bottom-up empowerment** in addition to top-down protection

 \rightarrow Research outcome will be published as an academic book
