CSO and Government Relations before Open Data

- There are paradigm differences in the utilization of public data
- CSOs also experience difficulty in accessing data which are
 - Complete
 - Accurate
 - Relevant
 - Timely
 - And responsive to the needs of CSOs and citizens

Changes noticed with Open Data Intervention

Supply-side

- Proactive attitude of government to provide data to the public
- Data provided by government = data needed by the CSOs

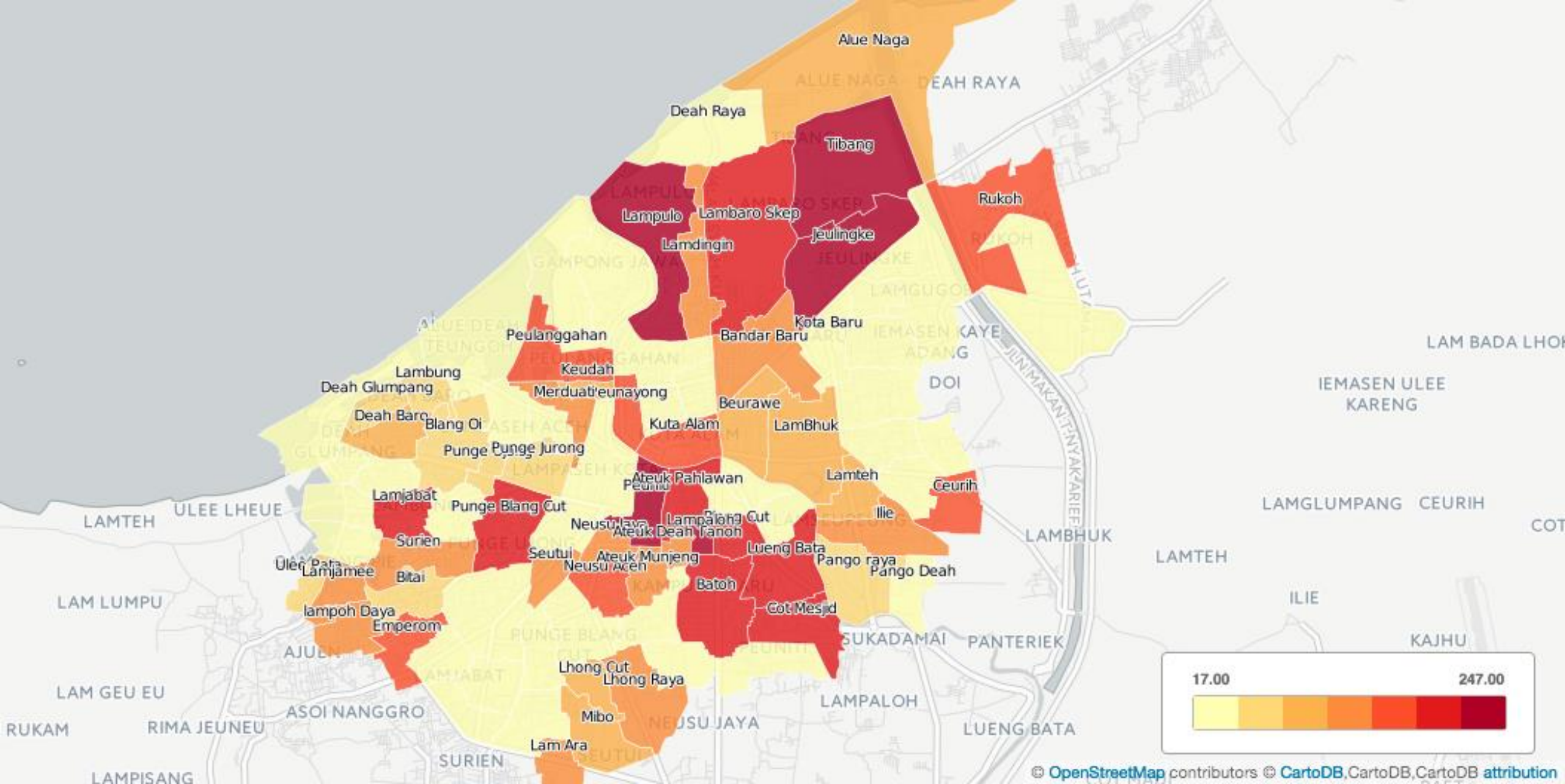
Demand-side

- Awareness of the importance of data as a tool for advocacy and programming
- Ease of access to public data
- The ability to process and visualize the data

Example of data use by CSO

Andproof of advocacy

- Government provided data on 10 diseases affecting people as recorded by health centers in Banda Aceh (CSV)
- PKBI did an analysis of diarrhoea incidence
 - Data processing:
 - Separation + grouping (PHC → village)
 - Identification of location coordinates
 - Visualization (e.g. CartoDB)
- Identification and discussion of factors related to the spread of diarrhoea

Learnings

- CSOs can participate to determine priority data to be provided by the government – making data provision more responsive
- There is a need to increase the capacity of CSOs to use open data
- Improvement of quality of service information to the government increase confidence CSO
