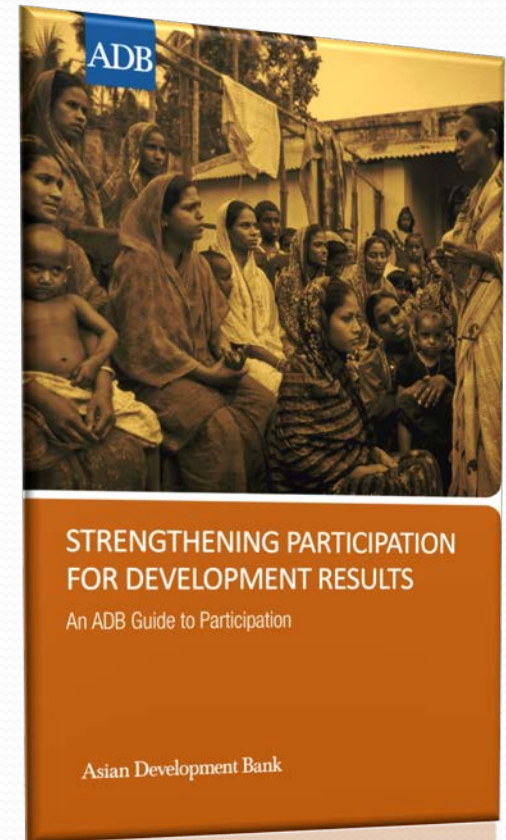
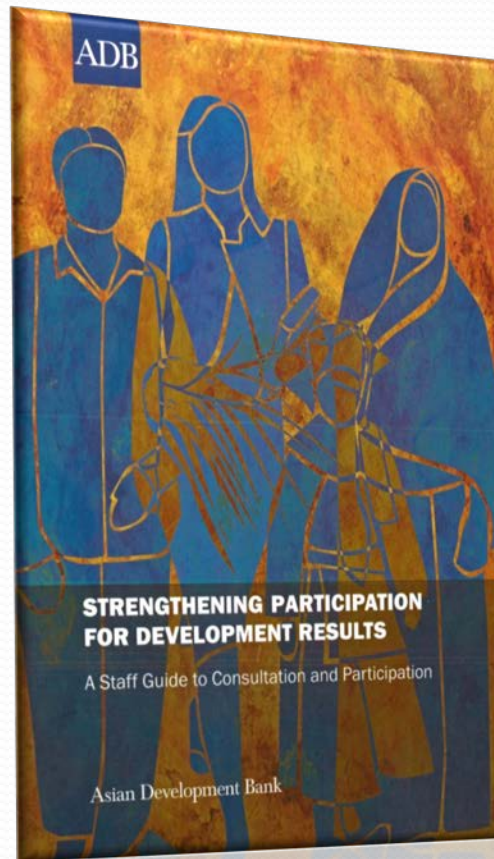
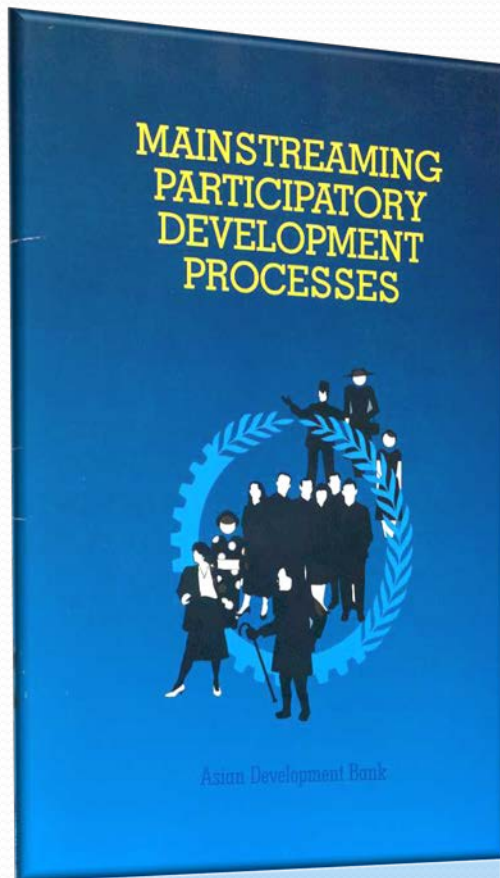
# Types of Work
