Global Picture: Adolescent Situation

- **1 in 6 persons** in the world is an adolescent: that is 1.2 billion people **aged 10 to 19**.
- There are **49 births per 1000 girls** aged 15 to 19 per year.
- An estimated **1.3 million adolescents died** in 2015, mostly from preventable or treatable causes.
- Other main causes of adolescent deaths include HIV, suicide, lower respiratory infections, and interpersonal violence.

MANILA, Philippines - Most of those who reportedly bought illegal drugs at a May 21 concert in Pasay City – where five people died – were 18 years older and younger, a source said yesterday.

Event promoter Joshua Habalo, who was arrested by National Bureau of Investigation agents in a drug sting Saturday morning, admitted that most of his customers were young, an insider said.

Habalo "told the NBI that the drugs were popular among the youth" at the concert, the source said, adding that some of those who bought were as young as 12.
