






Challenges

- 1. No Procurement Act/Policy
- 2. Capacity development
- 3. Inadequate Infrastructure

Way Forward

- 1. Business Continuity Plan
- 2. TOT training and user Training schedule from April 2017
- 3. Four piloting agencies covering works and goods
- 4. Soft Launching schedule in June 2017
- 5. Rollout gradually (trageted in January 2018)
- 6. Government issued executive order for full compliance
