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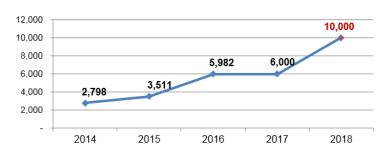

1. Overview of the PKH

 From small pilot in 2007, now one of world's largest conditional cash transfer (CCT) programs, with major expansion plans



 Program evolution over time: simplified benefits, more inclusive (elderly, disabled, remote areas), new family development sessions (FDS)

Beneficiaries	Benefit per household per year

Elderly, disabled, or in Papua or West Papua	2,000,000	\$14 8	

- Positive evaluation results:
 - HH expenditure
 - Pre-natal visits and immunization
 - Junior secondary net enrollment
 - Elementary attendance
 - Working hours of children





The proposed TA: rationale

- Sustained economic growth has significantly reduced poverty

 but both poverty and inequality remain formidable challenges.
- Increased investments in targeted social assistance and plans to rapidly expand — but the major scale-up will increase program complexity and put pressure on capacity.
- 3. Management information systems need to be strengthened.
- Reaching the poor and vulnerable in remote and disadvantaged regions poses a major challenge.
- 5. Awareness and appreciation of social assistance programs is weak, especially among key stakeholders.
