SEC. 28. *Components of the Mandatory Training Programs.* – The Commission and the DILG with the assistance of the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP), the Local Government Academy (LGA), the **University of the Philippines-National College of Public Administration and Governance (UP-NCPAG)**, and in consultation with youth stakeholders shall jointly design and implement the mandatory and continuing training programs. The mandatory training programs<sup>1</sup> must include among others, the following components: (a)(1) The Philippine cultural history, political systems ethics and ideologies; (2) The Filipino as a nation builder (3) The Filipino youth and its role in nation-building; and (b) capability building on leadership, program and project development and sustainability, financial management, and accountability and transparency.

# Republic Act 10742

## REFORM LAW

Signed by President Aquino on January 15, 2016.

- AGE EXPANSION**  
Candidates for SK shall be 18 to 24 years on the day of elections.  
SK Officials are now allowed to sign contracts, thus, they are expected to be more responsible in the utilization of their funds.
- ANTI-POLITICAL DYNASTY**  
The SK Reform Bill is the first of its kind that includes an anti-political dynasty provision.  
Relatives up to the 2nd degree of consanguinity and affinity of incumbent elected officials are not allowed to run.
- FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE**  
The barangay shall allocate 10% of the general fund to SK and it must be disbursed solely for youth development.  
SK's budget shall be deposited in the name of SK in a government-owned bank.
- LOCAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (LYDC)**  
The LYDC shall be composed of representatives of youth organizations in the LGU.  
It shall assist the planning and execution of projects and programs of SK.  
The local chief executive may appoint a youth development officer with the rank of at least division chief.
- MANDATORY TRAININGS and LINGGO NG KABATAAN**  
SK Officials must undergo mandatory training programs before he or she can assume office.  
SK and LYDC shall lead the observance of the "Linggo ng Kabataan" to be held consequent with the International Youth Day every August.
