Country knowledge plan: Demand-driven, operational benefits, coordinated, collaboration, sharing

- Economic monitoring and Asian Development Outlook:
 - Surveillance – what’s been happening, and why?
 - Forecasting – what’s going to happen, and why? What are the risks to the outlook, and why?
- Demand driven knowledge support for policy and planning:
 - Mid term planning – Energy, food & water security, skills & education, structural reform, innovative financing
 - Thematic knowledge products – SOE reform, land value capture, economic history, productive employment
- Support for strengthening analytical tools and high level policy dialogue:
 - Tools and capacity building – Inter-regional CGE model (INDOTERM) and the Indonesia Nowcast Model
 - Ministry of Finance’s Annual International Forum on Economic Development and Public Policy

- Provide demand-driven, responsive, and timely knowledge support;
- Maximize the operational benefits of knowledge;
- Coordinate knowledge support with other development partners and effectively mobilize cofinancing;
- Collaborate closely with nonstate knowledge users; and
- Enhance in-country knowledge dissemination.

Asia Development Outlook: 4 times a year

- Indonesia Chapter
 - Ongoing surveillance – CIN and monthly “economic wrap-up” note
 - Economic tools – Macro-monitoring tool and Nowcast model
 - Consultations – Bank Indonesia, MOF, WB/IMF, ratings agencies, other analysts
 - Knowledge sharing – Dissemination through a press conference, participation in economic forums, and meetings requested by analysts
 - Operational benefits – Analysis used in technical assistance and lending related work
- Regional Outlook and Theme Chapter
 - Regional chapter – Requested to share the regional outlook as part of the consultation process
 - Theme chapter – Regularly requested to present findings from theme chapter at Bank Indonesia and MOF



OPPORTUNITIES



Stepping up on knowledge:

- Strengthen RM knowledge work through a knowledge focal point
- Improve knowledge flow:
 - One-SERD – e.g., ASEAN policy network
 - One-ADB – e.g., ADO as a knowledge initiative linking ERCD and RMs
- Incentivize knowledge work in RMs through the country knowledge plan:
 - Provide demand-driven, responsive, and timely knowledge support
 - Maximize the operational benefits of knowledge
