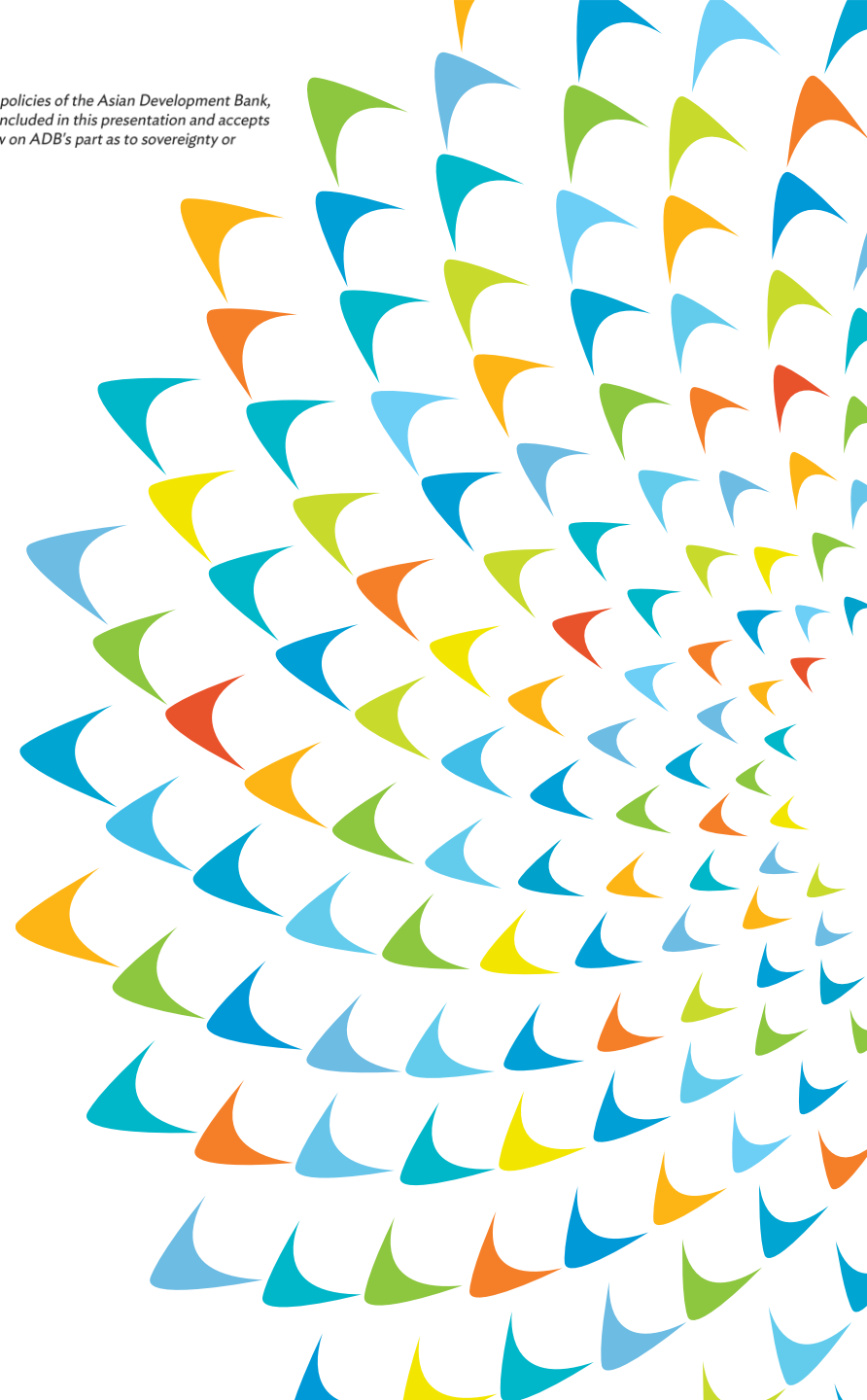

Proposed Project Outputs

- (i) Climate proofed sustainable small-scale infrastructure built and improved, including ecological protection and restoration of the Li River, waste water infrastructure managed, ancient villages and towns rehabilitated, pedestrian and cycling facilities constructed;
- (ii) Sustainable tourism facilities built and improved, which will include Li River infrastructure and small-scale tourism service support facilities constructed and managed; and
- (iii) Sustainable and inclusive tourism and river management capacity strengthened, and behavioral change campaign conducted.
