- Низкий уровень реализации ЦУР
- Более высокие государственные расходы
- Низкое качество предоставления государственных услуг
- Риск в области управления
- Низкие капитальные затраты
- Снижение доходов
- Высокий суверенный и гарантированный государством долг

Слабые государственные институты (субнациональные)

Непоследовательные меры политики и планирование

Недостаточная ясность в мандатах

Низкий уровень прозрачности и подотчетности

Ограниченное фискальное пространство / низкий уровень доходов

Отсутствие координационных механизмов

Слабая система УГФ, налогово-бюджетная сфера и меры политики

Недостаточно развития благоприятная среда для локализации ЦУР

Достижению целей ЦУР на субнациональном / местном уровне уделялось недостаточно внимания.
