Skills for the Green Transformation

- People are key for the economic transformation, but there is an investment gap
- Increased interest of commissioning parties and partner countries
- Strategic priorities:
 - Support skilled labour supply on all education levels
 - Ensure mainstreaming of environmental issues, climate change and resource efficiency in all education measures
 - Create conducive framework conductions, also by utilizing synergies, between our work in specific sectors, such as renewable energy, and our work on skills and jobs for the green transformation





Specifics of projects focussing on skills for the green transformation

- Activities within education projects or strong education components in sectoral projects
- Address different educational levels to cover the need for upand reskilling
- Mainstreaming green skills in conventional sectors and addressing new green sectors
- Need to bring together a variety of stakeholders and strengthen their cooperation
- Take into account the framework conditions for the development of the green economy and the influence they have on labour demand
- Ensure to include vulnerable groups and consider the high degree of informality in some sectors relevant for the transformation






