## An Urbanizing Asia and the Pacific

### **Urbanization**

- From 20% in the 1950s to 48% in 2018, 55% by 2030
  - Requires investments of \$1.7 trillion per year



### Housing

- 564 million (64%) of the world's slum dwellers



### **Urban Water Supply and Wastewater Management**

- 300 million people with no safe drinking water
- 80% of wastewater discharged without primary treatment
- 1.2 billion people lack access to basic sanitation



### Solid Waste Management

- 1.8 billion tons of municipal waste generated per year by 2025



### **Climate Change and Disaster**

- Cities consume about 60% to 80% of total energy supply
- 40% of natural disasters occur in the region.
- Home to 6 of 10 of the world's most vulnerable countries



Strategy 2030 identified "Making Cities More Livable" as one of its seven operational priorities




## Way Forward: Post-Pandemic Livable Cities and ADB's Portfolio

- ADB's project commitments in livable cities projects have a high potential to increase in the immediate and short-and medium-term
- Cities need to align "Immediate actions and emergency responses" to "Short- and mediumterm measures" to maximize opportunities to 'Build Back Better'
- Livable Cities projects will see a shift:
  - Integration in urban planning process strategically the lessons from COVID-19
  - Adoption of greater social protection measures for the most vulnerable groups
  - o Improvement of urban environments including uninterrupted urban services
  - Measures to strengthen financial sustainability, financial inclusion, and building capacities of urban institutions and other stakeholders
  - o Increased use of technologies and digital solutions in cities on all aspects of urban governance
- Cities can turn the crisis into an opportunity and work towards being more safe, healthy, inclusive, environmentally sustainable, and resilient during and after post-COVID-19
- ADB will continue to help cities understand their challenges and opportunities, and support their visions, plans, and road maps to become more livable




## **In Summary**
