

Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP) is the practice of making purchasing decisions with due consideration for the **environmental, social, economic, and institutional impacts** of




Sustainability Starts in Procurement Planning



The Strategic Procurement Plan for a project includes relevant guidance related to sustainability risks and opportunities within a project's supply chains.




It is at this stage that any of the identified sustainability requirements and performance incentives will be developed and included in the bidding documents to ensure that potential suppliers (bidders) respond to these requirements and are evaluated appropriately.






Bid Evaluation



 Bids from suppliers are evaluated as usual but also considering the sustainability features and benefits that suppliers are proposing within their solutions. Sustainability will be another consideration in selecting suppliers. Implementation and Contract Management



- Ongoing performance monitoring to ensure that the suppliers deliver in accordance with the sustainability specifications, contract terms, and/or KPIs.
- Sustainability results are openly and transparently reported.

Role of Technical Consultants

- Lead market sounding research and assessment
- Lead the creation of the Strategic Procurement Plan with advising from other groups
- Lead the development of Bid Packages and determining criteria
- Involved in Bid Evaluation and Contract Management


Role of Suppliers

- Engage in market sounding with technical consultants
- Provide data on market feasibility for sustainable procurement
- Prepare bid responses that effectively respond to sustainability requirements
- Report on sustainability outcomes related to projects

Effectively Responding to Sustainability in Bids

- Respond directly to the questions that are asked; provide information that is specific and tangible (recent past performance is preferred over future promises)
- Provide concrete data on the sustainability features and benefits of your product, your services or works (e.g. ecolabels, product specific certifications, performance ratings, work methodology plan for waste minimisation/ local training)
- Where requested in the procurement documents, provide separate information on your company's sustainability leadership initiatives (e.g. corporate policies, company certifications, sustainability targets); avoid information that is only applicable to a parent company and not yours!
