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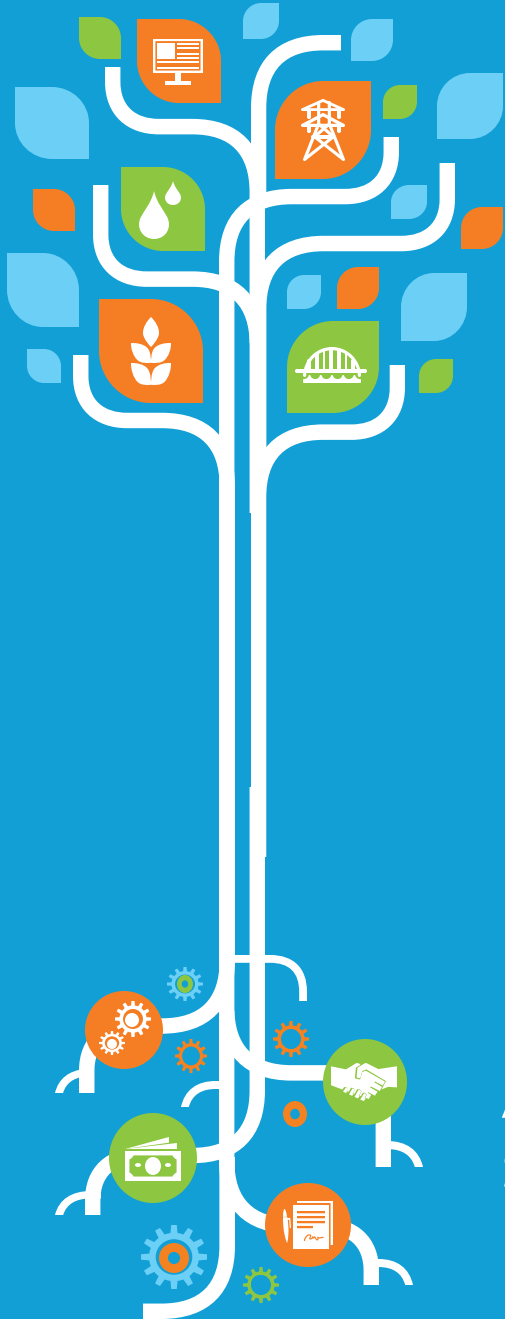

Progress Towards Universal Health Coverage up to 2019

Developing Asia had **mixed progress** on the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 3 UHC-related indicators

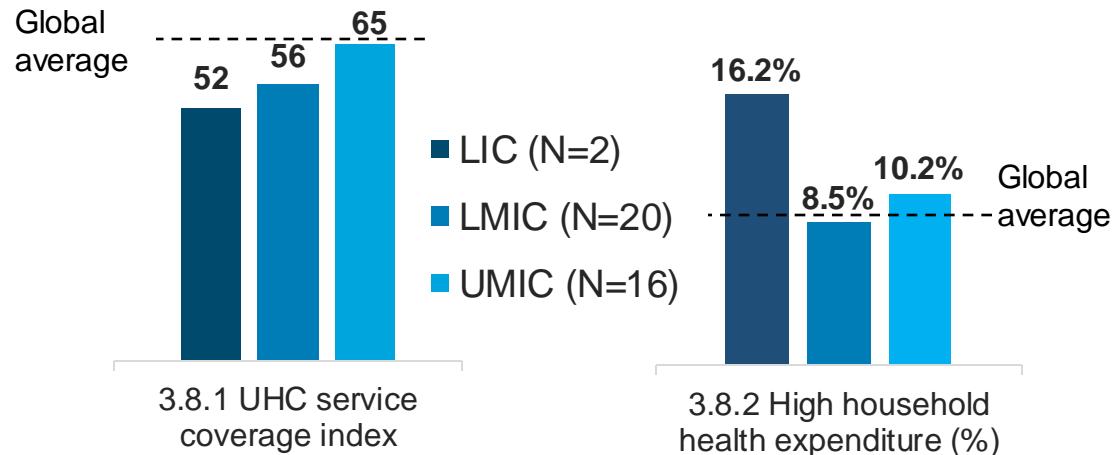
- DMCs across income groups performed below the global average on the **service coverage index**
- Upper middle-income economies (UMIC) had high proportion of households facing significant **out-of-pocket spending**

Health systems face **challenges**, including:

- **Epidemics/pandemics** disrupting health supply and demand, workforce losses, and high economic cost
- **Triple burden** – maternal and child health, rising non-communicable diseases, and trauma and road injuries
- **Stress on human health from climate change**
- **Fiscal pressure on the social sector**
- Rapid **urbanization** and **demographic shifts**

SDG 3: UHC indicators, 2019

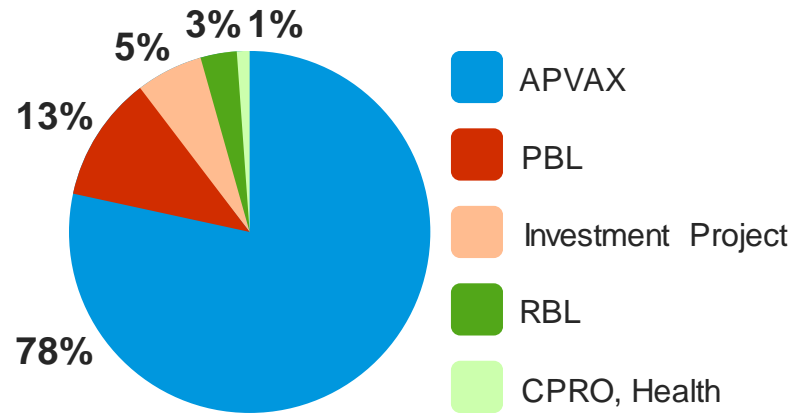
ADB Asia Pacific Countries with Operations¹



ADB Health Sector Composition and Pipeline

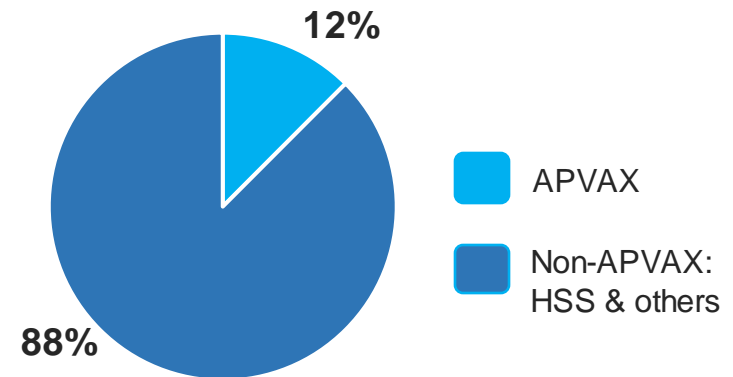

In December 2020, ADB launched its **USD 9 billion Asia Pacific Vaccine Access Facility (APVAX)**. Under this, as of 11 October 2022 ADB had committed USD 5.32 billion in financing across 16 approved projects, of which ADB's own financing is USD 4.2 billion (reflected in chart), cofinancing is USD 1.12 billion.

Altogether, APVAX expects to finance 1.02 billion doses of vaccines

Vision and approach for ADB's Health Sector Directional Guide (HSDG), 2021-2030

Vision: Provide financing and knowledge products to rapidly progress to universal health coverage in Asia and the Pacific.

Key trends: Provide long-term strategic direction, guide knowledge activities, input in DMC engagement via CPS, influence multi-sectoral endeavors

Highlighted ADB health infrastructure investments



1. Hospital and secondary health infrastructure

Project examples:

- **Pakistan: \$100M Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Health System Strengthening Program** (committed loan, 2022) – focused on quality of care in hospitals in KP province, including modernization of infrastructure and equipment, supply chains
- **Thailand: \$255M Medical Excellence Centers project** (planned loan, 2023) – expansion in tertiary-level hospital infrastructure in five health regions, increase in medical/nursing capacity, green health infrastructure in public sector hospitals

Key opportunities



Green health infrastructure: building design, low-carbon energy, process improvement



Sustainable medical waste management: on-site waste compaction & incineration, biological waste disposal



EMRs / MIS / other IT systems: integrated, highly digitized, scalable solutions



Climate and disaster-risk resilience: Climate-proofing, adaptive management, staff training

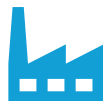


2. Pharmaceutical manufacturing

Project examples:

- **Bangladesh: (financing \$TBD) Vaccine Manufacturing Project** (planned loan, 2023-24) – With TA support for design, structural engineering, facility construction, equipment procurement, installation, commissioning and validation of project. Financed facility will manufacture human and animal vaccines. Supported by enhancement of country regulatory capacity and manufacturing related technical knowhow.

Key opportunities



Design and engineering: pre-construction design and feasibility; equipment plans



On-site quality control and improvement: prevention of on-site contamination, BSL 2/3, six-sigma



Training and systems: staff capacity development, process improvement, ICT



Regulation and business planning: Managing regulatory approvals, process control, long-term planning for expansion, etc.



ADB focus on digital technologies for the social sector

Improved government services

- Digital technology to boost growth, expand opportunity and increase efficiency and effectiveness of public services
- Address data privacy and other regulatory challenges

Targeted investment & partnerships

- Invest in infrastructure, capacity and skills to realize the benefits of digital technology
- Use ADB managed trust funds and other financing to invest in both public and private actors

Foster an enabling environment

- Encourage entrepreneurship, self-governance and effective regulation, as well as innovation
- Promote reaching scale with developmental impact



Highlighted projects in digital health



1. Digital financing for health

Project examples:

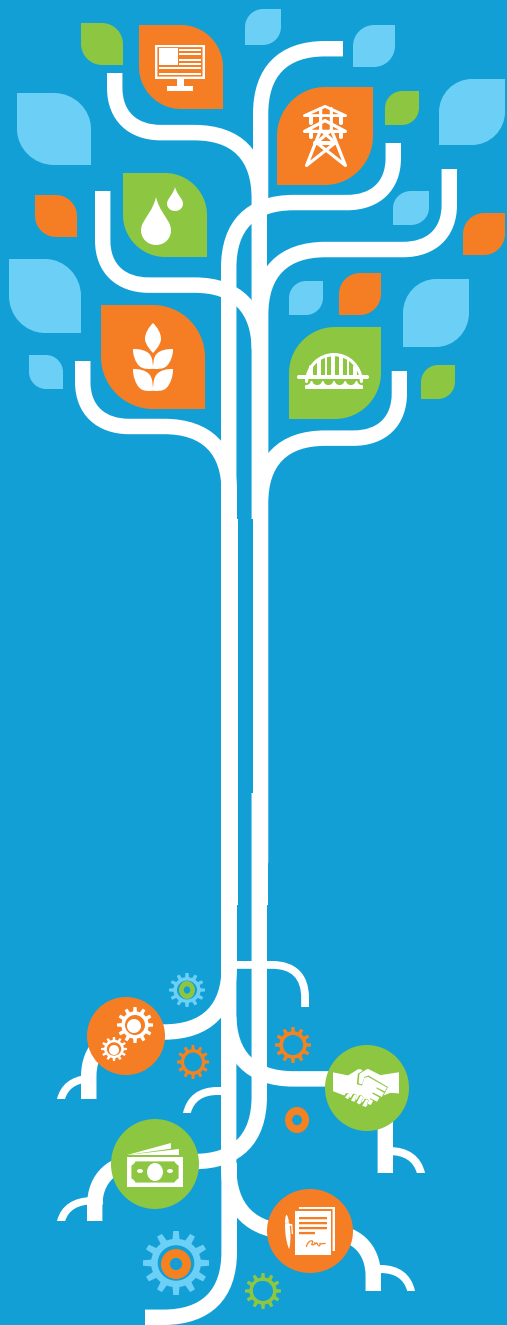
- **Regional technical assistance project: \$2.5M *Using digital technology to improve national health financing.***(ongoing) – Working in six countries to conduct assessments and provide support to help digitalize the business processes of health insurers, increase interoperability between insurers and CRVS, national ID systems, increasing use of digital payments for health
 - ***Forthcoming procurement in Q4 2022: \$1.3M*** support across multiple countries, including innovation challenge for digital health financing (2023)



2. eHealth, electronic medical records, HIS

Project examples:

- **Support to Lao People's Democratic Republic.**(ongoing) – Support to electronic medical records implementation, national digital health ID system (link with CRVS and national ID), etc.
 - Current international consultant for Lao PDR represents French expertise
