

ABS for PTWS - Worldwide

SRF is calling for ABS to be fitted (as a minimum) to the front wheel of every powered two-wheeler that has a maximum design speed in excess of 50kph. This is vital as in many parts of Asia motorcycles with 70cc, 90cc and 110cc engines are used. To save lives in significant numbers, it is essential that countries adopt ABS for ALL machines which have speeds of 50kph or more. Only fitting ABS to models over 125cc would result in very little meaningful change as they only constitute a relatively small percentage of the total number of PTWs sold.
