

### ADB 2021 Sovereign Portfolio by Region (\$ billion) TOTAL US\$ 104b






# ADB 2021 Non-Sovereign Portfolio





### **Strategy 2030: Seven Operational Priorities**





- Since 1994 (first country in Central Asia to join ADB)
- Total committed lending: \$6.4 billion for 44 loans
  - > 11 private sector loans and guarantees for \$543.6 million.
- > 101 technical assistance projects (\$57.8 million).
- Active portfolio:
  - three projects and one special assistance grant (\$470.5 million);
  - 11 TA projects (\$9.0 million)





- Country Partnership Strategy (CPS), 2017–2021 for Kazakhstan
- New CPS 2023–2027, which is under preparation
- ADB's Strategy 2030
