




# **ADB Operations**











Figure 15: Sovereign Portfolio at a Glance (\$ billion)






### Types of business opportunities

### **Overall Procurement in 2022**





#### Welcome to ADB's Operational Procurement Statistics Dashboard (ProcDash)

The Operational Procurement Statistics Dashboard (ProcDash) presents the value of all goods, works and consulting services contracts awarded for projects under the Asian Development Bank operations. It has four sections, namely, overview, operational procurement by nationality, operational procurement by origin of goods and services, and operational procurement by threshold. For purposes of this dashboard, value of operational procurement is reported in terms of the amount financed by ADB.

The overview section presented below shows data on operational procurement statistics by region, nature, sector and by borrowing country. Data can be further filtered by contract year and modality. To determine the allocated procurement for policy-based support and results-based lending, click these two items in the modality filter.

For other details about ProcDash, refer to ProcDash FAQ.

ProcDash can also be used to supplement the operational procurement statistics under the Operational Data section of the ADB Annual Report and the figures from the member Fact Sheets. More information on operational procurement contracts is available on the Tenders page of ADB's website (choose "Contracts Awarded" from the "Type" selection).

The ProcDash currently shows data as of 31 March 2021. This will be updated every quarter.









### **ADB's procurement frameworks**


### **Roles and Responsibilities**


- The Borrower (Executing Agency (EA)) is responsible to procure most goods, works, and services
- ADB also procures some services and goods itself to support its borrowers through technical assistance grants (TA) and staff consulting
- ADB reviews the procurement activities of EAs to ensure compliance with ADB's Procurement Policy and Procurement Regulations for Borrowers
- Open competitive bidding is the preferred option
- Technical and financial bid elements



### **ADB's Anticorruption Policy & Guidelines**

Applies to executing and implementing agencies, contractors, consultants, suppliers, ADB staff, and anyone connected to an ADB-financed, -administered, or —supported activity.

### Types of Consultants





#### Recruitment may be national or international

- International may be for any ADB member country (global if eligibility restriction waived)
- A firm is considered national if it is legally incorporated in that DMC
- An individual is national if a citizen of the DMC or, if a national from another member country, he/she legally resides and works in that DMC.

# Procurement Methods to Recruit Firms







### New selection method for firms


- ADB has launched a new, pilot selection method for recruiting consulting firms known as "simplified consultants' qualifications selection" (SCQS)
- It aims to reduce recruitment times by half or more
- Time-saving features include:
  - Single-stage, single-envelope proposal process
  - Proposal length kept short for faster submission and evaluation
  - Fully electronic submission forms in CMS
  - Evaluation is based on highest technical score within maximum budget
  - Financial evaluation follows cost competitive principles
  - Documents necessary for negotiations and any desired changes to the standard contract are raised within the proposal itself
- Opportunities are now being advertised on CMS using SCQS
- The pilot is initially approved for ADB-administered selections with maximum budget up to \$500k until Dec. 2024



## Working with ADB: A Primer for Identifying Business Opportunities for NGOs

NGOs can successfully implement ADB-financed contracts. But NGOs bidding for ADB contracts need to think like a consulting firm. Here are some other tips:

- NGOs are expected to cover all of their costs and overheads from an ADB contract. The contract budget does not have to be prepared on an at-cost basis.
- ADB's budget template does not include a line for administrative or indirect costs such as NICRA. Therefore, prepare a budget that breaks down and covers all indirect costs. ADB allows a multiplier for monthly salaries of between 2.0 and 3.0 for full-time employees. See page 3, paragraph F of ADB's Standard Forms for proposal submissions.
- Engage a dedicated administrator with strong finance skills to manage your ADB contract and include the administrator in your proposal.
- If possible, reach out to the ADB Headquarters in Manila and meet staff there working across the Asia and the Pacific region.
- Maximize the information, education and communication resources of the ADB website, including signing up for the ADB Alerts to get timely updates.







- Remember not to treat an ADB contract as funding for organizational activities; instead play the role of a service provider that ADB requires.
- Be familiar with ADB's requirements, and consider your NGO's own institutional requirements, which may not support this type of contract.
- Read the ADB contract and become familiar with it. ADB does not provide training on its own procedures but expects those it engages to learn them.
- Keep good records and be prepared to provide clear statements of consulting inputs and actual inputs.
- Realize that ADB's standard conditions of contract are non-negotiable.







## Tips for winning ADB-financed assignments

- Collect relevant business intelligence network!
- Focus on performance and reputation for successful work
- Express interest
- Understand the country, project, and client requirements
- Position yourself to your competitive advantage
- Study the bidding documents and understand the selection method and evaluation criteria
- Engage partnership with firms likely to be shortlisted
- Prepare a responsive and strong technical proposal
- Seek clarifications in writing
- Be ready for possible bid extensions or amendments





### What NOT to do

- Failure to disclose conflict of interest (e.g., employees from EA included in a proposal)
- Firm or JV partners not from an ADB member country
- Submitting proposal late
- Failure to respond to client requirements
- Conditional bids
- Incomplete/noncompliant bids, e.g., missing bid security, letter of bid not signed, JV agreement missing, bid envelopes not properly marked, etc.
- Integrity violations in the bidding process

When in doubt, always seek written clarification





## **Debriefing and Complaints**

### Debriefing:

- Unsuccessful bidders may request debriefing from the procuring entity (the EA or ADB). If they are not satisfied with the explanation given, they may submit a complaint.

  Debriefings are an excellent learning opportunity for future bids!

### Complaints:

- Bidders may file complaint directly with ADB and may copy ADB on correspondence with EAs.

The Procurement, Portfolio and Financial Management Department (PPFD) provides fiduciary oversight of procurement of goods, works, non-consulting and consulting services. PPFD supports ADB staff and borrowers on procurement planning and implementation, contract management, and related risk assessment and mitigation throughout the project life cycle. It also leads procurement and consulting services innovation and capacity building initiatives.

ADB reviews and approves the prequalification process conducted by the Borrower's executing agency and publishes lists of prequalified contractors for contracts with estimated value of \$10,000,000 and above.



Consultant Management System (CMS) is an integrated web-based system that supports the ADB's consulting services recruitment, from advertising the opportunity to awarding consulting contracts. This portal will enable users to work with the different facilities available in CMS.



Consultants create and update their profile, search opportunities, send Expressions of Interest (EOIs), respond to Non-Committal Inquiries (NCIs), and prepare and submit proposals. Login to the system by typing in your registered email address and password.

Since CSRN is now integrated in CMS, consultants are encouraged to complete their full registration to help facilitate EOI submission by tagging project and consulting experiences entered in their profile.

### Consulting Services Recruitment Notice (CSRN)

The Consulting Services Recruitment Notice provides detailed information on the consulting services required for ADB-financed or administered projects. The CSRN includes the terms of reference and is posted on ADB's website for at least one month for firms for EA-administered projects, 15 days for firms for ADB-administered projects or 7 days for individual consultants before shortlisting.

This will provide consultants sufficient time to prepare EOIs that are more specific and focused on the project's requirements.




