




#### Background

1973 until 2015 there has been deforestation of 18,7 million hectares in Kalimantan's forests.

**FIP 1:** Community-focused Investment to Address Deforestation and Degradation Project (Administered by ADB)

**FIP2:** Promoting Sustainable Community-based Natural Resource Management and Institutional Development (Administered by World Bank)



## FIP1

- Promotes sustainable forest management (SFM)
- Reduce GHG emissions and enhance carbon stocks
- Provide livelihood co-benefits such as poverty reduction, improved livelihood for forest communities, strengthened land management rights of customary communities.
  - 2 districts, 17 villages, 4 forest management units (FMUs), 672,202 hectares forest area and 23,932 hectares non-forest area.

# Agroforestry

- Plant tree species that provide economic benefit to farmers groups and ecological benefit (hydrological support, environmental services, and biodiversity conservation).
- Intercrop plants such as: vegetables, paddy, and medicinal plants.
- Crops cultivation using a shifting cultivation practice where they divide the forest area into 5-6 blocks and they will rotate those blocks every year, so in the 5/6th year, they will come back to the first block

### Assisted Natural Regeneration (ANR)

- Forest farmers groups trained to protect forest and maintain local natural seedlings in the lowdegraded forest from any disturbance from tree falling, grass, climbers and from forestfire
- With ANR, community is able to legally access forest area and utilize any non-timber forest product for their livelihood (honey, rattan)



# **ANR Project Impact**

Around 19 thousand local tree species were identified




Non-timber forest products: honey, rattan, weaving

# FOOD PROCESSING



#### Increasing Women's Participation

At least 30% women in consultation processes and community forest management groups.

At least 30% women beneficiaries from training programs on livelihood skills

At least 3 women-only groups established as pilots to support nontimber forest products-based microenterprise development.

Study visits for women to share and learn from similarly engaged women's community groups
