Case of COVID-19 Hospital in Baku

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Background

- Special quarantine regime was applied March 2020 (approx. 830.000 infected, 10.000 fatal cases)
- Module type COVID-19 hospital of the Ministry of Emergency Situations opened July 2020
- I.A (also director of private MediStyle LLC) was appointed as the director of the hospital

• Anti-Corruption Directorate received a complaint — director's assistant requested 1.800 \$ to admit applicant's relative to the hospital

A criminal case was opened in April 2021
 as a result of undercover operation





Offences, Charges and Evidences

- Director I.A and head of division R.V arranged admittance of 140 patients only through ambulance service of *MediStyle LLC* in return of 120-900 \$/person approx. 30.000 \$ in total (without receipt)
- Through his assistants received bribes 6.800 \$ in 6 instances (from patients and their relatives)
- Head of division R.V. contracted COVID-19 himself, but the director arranged for him to leave the hospital grounds

Charges:

- Director and head of division were charged with Articles 139-1.2 (aggravated violation of quarantine regime), 308.2 (aggravated abuse of office), 311.3.1 (passive bribery on preliminary arrangement by a group) and 311.3.2 (passive bribery, repeatedly)
- Director's assistants were charged with Articles 308.2, 311.3.1 and 311.3.2

Evidences:

• witness statements, cross examinations, interception of phone conversations/communication, forensic evidences (voice identification, financial, documents)





Prosecution

- Pre-trial investigation finished in September 2021
- March 2022 Baku Grave Crimes Court convicted director and his 3 subordinates on all charges
- All four individuals were convicted from 5 to 8 years of imprisonment
- August 2022 Baku Appeal Court reduced sentences (3.5 to 4 years of imprisonment)
- December 2022 Supreme Court reduced sentences (2.5 to 3 years of imprisonment)



Challenges

- Hospital was operating in a special regime obstacle to conducting investigative actions (search, interrogation, SIM)
- Several patients forced to pay bribes died due to COVID-19
- Health risks for investigation team
- Relatives of patients-witnesses were not cooperative
- Large number witnesses (investigation team was involved)
- Lockdown restriction on movement of citizens
- Director of the hospital was from an influential family (witness tampering)
