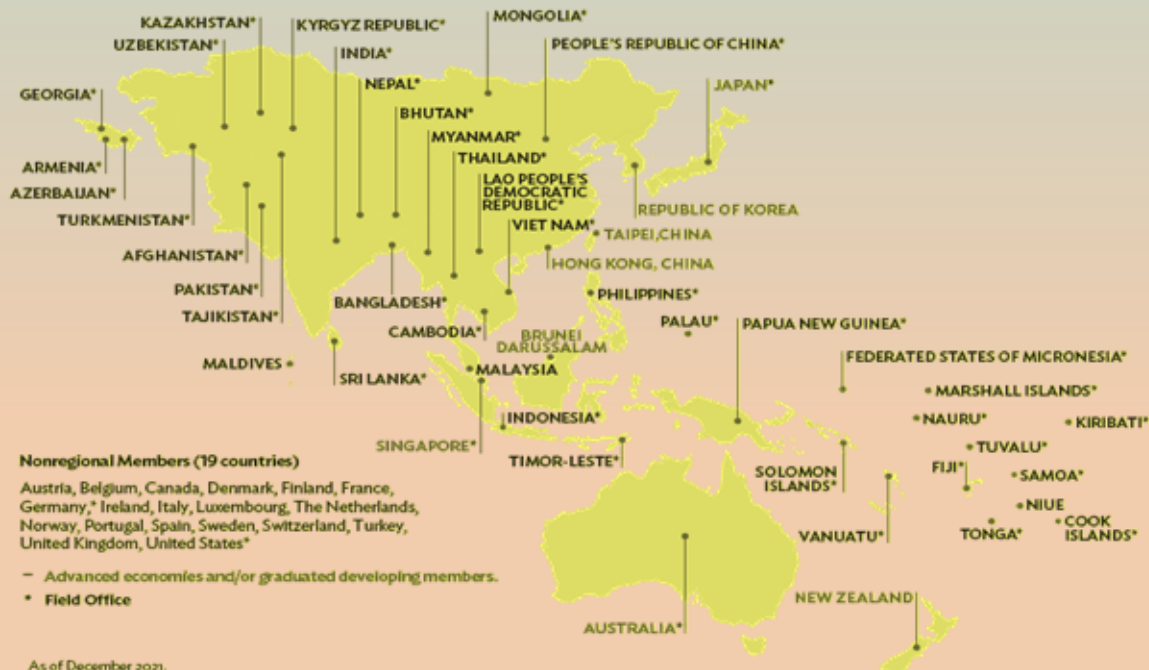

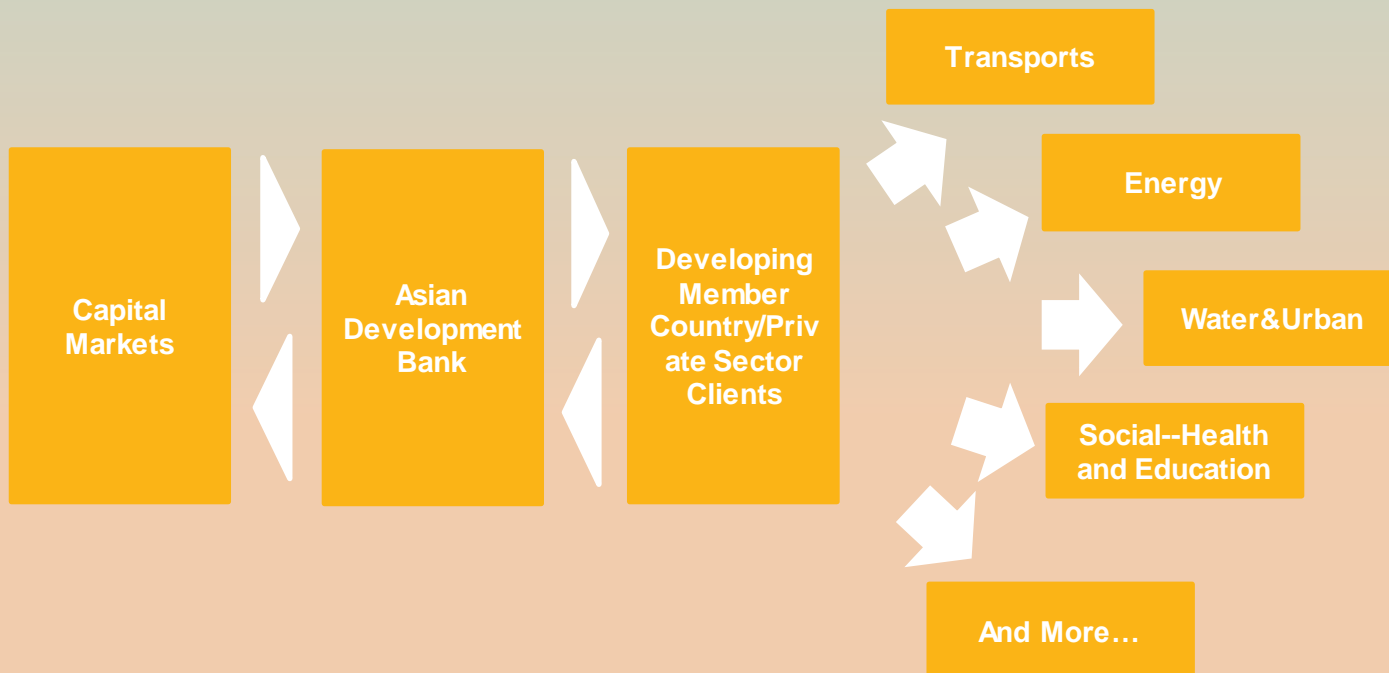

OUR LENDING MODEL



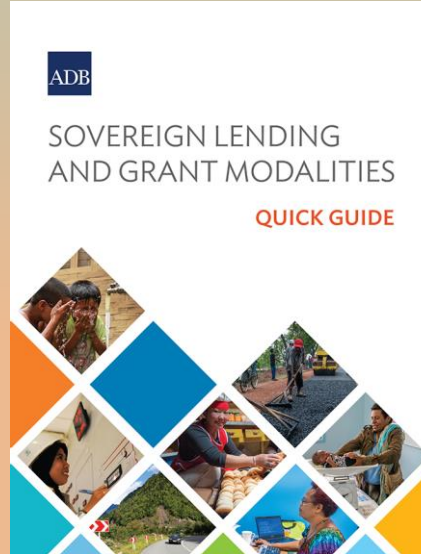
