





Achieved Results

- Strong and active 10 rural women groups were created locally in Armenia (3), Azerbaijan (3) and Georgia (4);
- 10 offices were opened in the regions of South Caucasus Countries and supplied with necessary equipment;
- RWCs were provide by adequate informational and educational materials for public awareness raising;
- 7 pilot projects were implemented;
- RWCs established effective cooperation with women associations and leader women; governmental agencies, NGO leaders, business sector, media;
- 10 IRMP (Integrated Risk Management Plan) documents were elaborated and agreed with stakeholders.




















The project results in figures:



- 191 SMEs have improved management practices and technologies
- 262 SMEs received USG technical assistance for improving their business performance
- 20 beneficiaries in Georgia and Armenia are using modern ICT applications provided by the project
- 12 SMEs established linkages with new buyers (25 local buyers, 3 international)
- 18 associations were supported to increase their capacities to improve competitiveness of SMEs
- The percentage of female participants that have attended the events organized by the project was 56 %
