Why Indigenous Perspectives Matter:

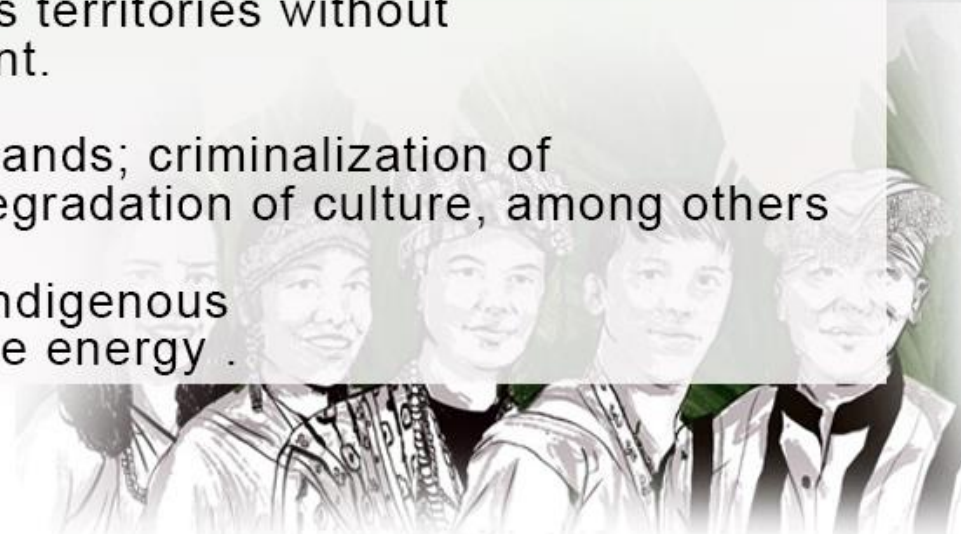
- Indigenous Peoples have contributed the least in the climate crisis but bear the brunt of the impacts of climate change.

Energy Challenges for Indigenous Communities:

- Historical exploitation of indigenous territories without their free prior and informed consent.
- Displacement from their ancestral lands; criminalization of dissent, human rights violations, degradation of culture, among others
- Inadequate and lack of access of indigenous communities to clean and affordable energy .

Ways Forward to Achieve Just Transition

- **Recognition and respect of indigenous peoples rights:**
land rights, self-determination including free, prior and informed consent and right to development
- **Ensure direct access to funding and equitable benefit sharing**
- **Recognize and support indigenous led renewable energy initiatives**
- **Promote inclusive governance structures that recognizes the role of indigenous peoples in decision making on renewable energy projects.**
- **Promote inclusive governance structures that recognizes the role of indigenous peoples including indigenous women and youth in decision making on renewable energy projects**
