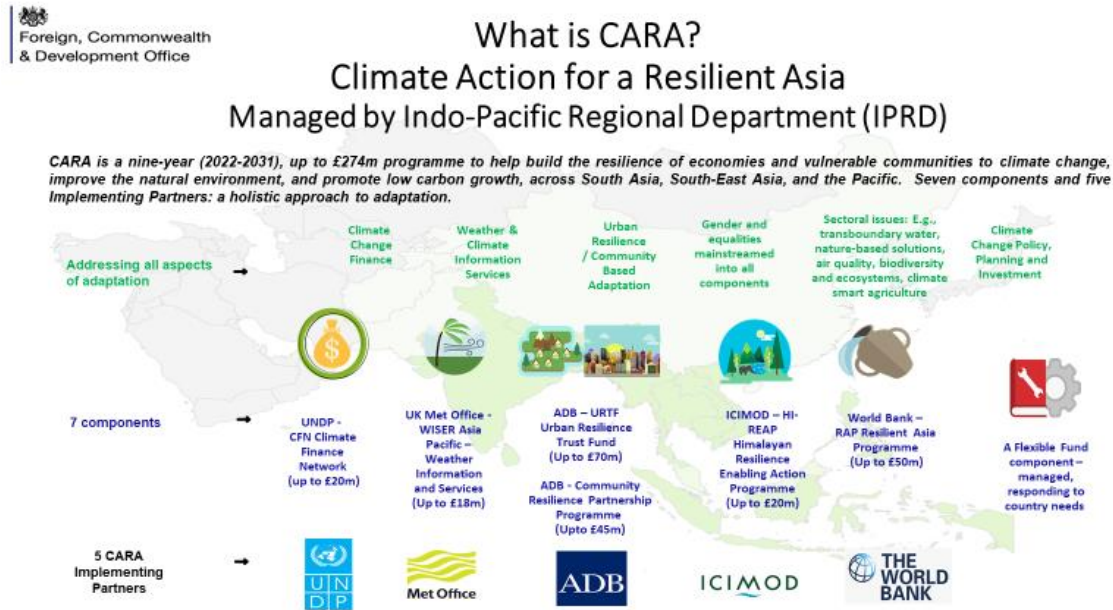

- Regionally, FCDO's flagship is CARA – Climate Action for a Resilient Asia



- Many UK Embassies and High Commissions in Asia have relevant bilateral climate and environment programmes, or in other areas such as support to health systems



## Opportunities for greater international cooperation and/or funding

The CARA components which are particularly relevant to BAQ are:

- The World Bank’s Resilient Asia Programme – on regional air sheds;
- ICIMOD’s Himalayan Resilience Enabling Action Programme – on practical air quality solutions, and;
- the ADB’s Urban Resilience Trust Fund – on various aspects of urban planning and management.
