## **ADBI** household survey in CAREC region

- Wave I & II: COVID-19 pandemic impacts on household e.g., socioeconomic status, employment, family business (if any), financial conditions, household expenditure, child education
- Wave III: inflation impacts on household; recovery from the pandemic
- Sample: Representative samples of 1,000+ households from each country
- Survey waves



- Wave I & II: 2021 and 2022 survey in 10 CAREC countries (excluding PRC)
- Wave III: 2023 survey in 9 CAREC countries + Armenia (excluding PRC and Turkmenistan)

### Map of study sites, wave III survey









# In 2023, how often, if ever, you did not have enough money to buy the necessary food?




