

ADB expanding financial support for Pacific Governments infrastructure needs



Working differently to support quality infrastructure in the Pacific





Approaches to support Pacific Government's quality infrastructure

- Use of Project Readiness Financing—for design- and procurement-ready projects prior to financing
- Upfront Resilience Assessments—to help make project designs appropriate to unique Pacific contexts
- Strategic Procurement Planning—to achieve quality outcomes with fit-for-purpose procurement approaches
- Additional **TA support**—to strengthen and supplement implementation capacity of EAs/IAs where necessary
- Regional approaches—working with regional institutions to enhance access to climate finance, promote disaster resilience and coordinate infrastructure planning (PIF, PRIF)






BUSINESS

Procurement is key pillar of quality infrastructure agenda

- ADB has developed a Pacific Procurement Approach (2021-2025) to strengthen the quality and impact of procurement outcomes.
- This Pacific Procurement Approach is based on five pillars of support
 - Improving market competition through merit point procurement, outreach and market surveys;
 - Increasing local economic benefits of procurement outcomes;
 - Strengthening Government procurement and project management capacity;
 - Enhancing ADB's internal staffing and procurement support structures; and
 - Reinforcing **regional partnership** and shared approaches.
- Key principle is that Pacific Governments are able to develop "fit for purpose" procurement approaches that prioritizes quality and their national development objectives while ensuring fair and transparent competition.





Scaling up use of merit-point procurement

- ADB continues to **promote the use of quality-focused** (merit point criteria or MPC) **evaluation systems** in the Pacific to improve development results.
 - Increased focus on quality non-price metrics in bid-evaluation criteria.
- In the last three years (2020–2022), MPC was used in 69% of large value (>\$10 million) goods and works packages.
- To further strengthen MPC adoption, ADB is:
 - developing additional knowledge products,
 - including MPC as the default evaluation method in its standard bidding documents and user guides,
 - providing training and related guidance materials to support its increased use, and
 - advocating with Pacific DMCs to adopt MPC as the standard evaluation method for large value contracts.



Expanding local economic benefits

- ADB seeks to maximize the secondary economic benefits that accrue to domestic economies through the delivery of infrastructure projects.
- During the procurement lifecycle, options include:
 - Undertaking a detailed market assessments to support Government's to design packages that reflect local market capacity; and
 - Introducing incentives in large packages to increase local participation by (i) including evaluation criteria that provide a scoring benefit to firms who present robust proposals to maximize local participation in the delivery of a contract, (ii) incorporating requirements for skills transfer and capacity development of local staff working on a project (e.g., the Build4Skills approach).

To promote more competition in Pacific procurement **ADB will continue to expand its business outreach** efforts and is introducing new metrics to allow for better tracking of procurement results.






