Social protection schemes to facilitate just transitions

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Indonesia: National strategy to accelerate early retirement of coal-fired power plants

Objective: To achieve net zero emissions by 2060

- Exiting coal power plants / mining industry = <u>Job loss / Employment termination</u>
- Promoting renewable energy = Job creation

How can social protection facilitate unemployed workers to return to work?

Country <u>with</u> unemployment benefits (social protection)

Unemployed workers access to a single-window / one-stop service

- Unemployment benefits during job search (e.g. 45 60% of wage up to 3 6 months)
- Public employment services (job counselling, vacancy database, job matching/fair, CV/interview training..)
- Public vocational training institution (referral to re/upskilling training, fee/lodging/transport allowance)


Senior workers required special treatments (employment, pension)

Country without unemployment benefits

Unemployed workers access to three separate/disconnected services

- Redundancy/severance/termination pay (<u>employer's liability</u>)
- Public employment services (weak capacity)
- Public vocational training institution (separate entrance requirements/procedure)

Key messages

The Energy Sector can drive the improvement in the social protection system.

- Money is there 1% of project budgets can assist in establishing a social protection policy.
- Create a momentum.
- Establish a mainstream and permanent scheme (instead of ad hoc one).
- Benefit not only workers affected by the transition but also all other unemployed workers.

Key issues (unemployment protection)

- Availability/Integration of unemployment benefits, PES and vocational training
- Compensation for small business supplying to closed power plants
- Social protection throughout life cycle

Linkage to employment injury benefits (e.g. occupational disability benefits)

Linkage to old-age benefits (e.g. early retirement of miners)
