





At least One Tele MANAS Cell to be established in each State/UT. (Total 51 cells)







Figure: The 'Valley of Death 'highlighting the various challenges faced in transition from ideation to successful commercialization of the product.






ADOPTION & DIFFUSION OF INNOVATION

ROGER'S INNOVATION ADOPTION CURVE





Technology Adoption Model In India






