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The Public Procurement Act, 2063 (2007)

• 67. Procurement Process under this Act not to be Applied:

the procurement process under this Act need not be applied in the following conditions:

(b) If as per the agreement between government of Nepal and donor party, procurement is to be made in accordance with the Procurement Guidelines of a donor party.

Procurement issues in Nepal (Consultancy)

- Abnormally Low Bids
- Frequent replacement

Updating quality



- use of <u>merit point criteria</u> for bid evaluation for big and strategic contracts with focus on energy and transport sectors;
- support upgrading of the procurement regulatory framework to promote performance based competitive bidding;
- assess adoption of alternative procurement arrangements with specific government agencies;
- provide recommendation for <u>wider participation of national and</u> <u>international bidders</u> in open competitive bidding advertisement;
- promote <u>sustainable public procurement</u> to encourage social, environmental, climate and finance best practices in construction;
- 6) country / sector procurement risk assessment

- Minimum score to be qualified
- Ratio with Financial Proposals
