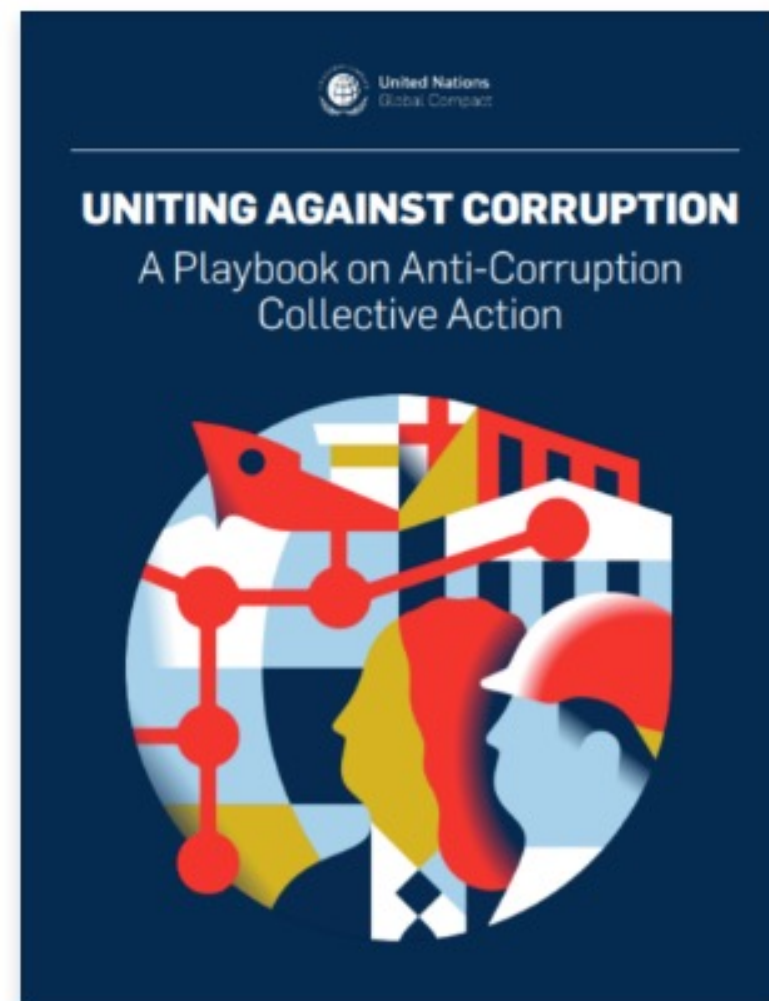

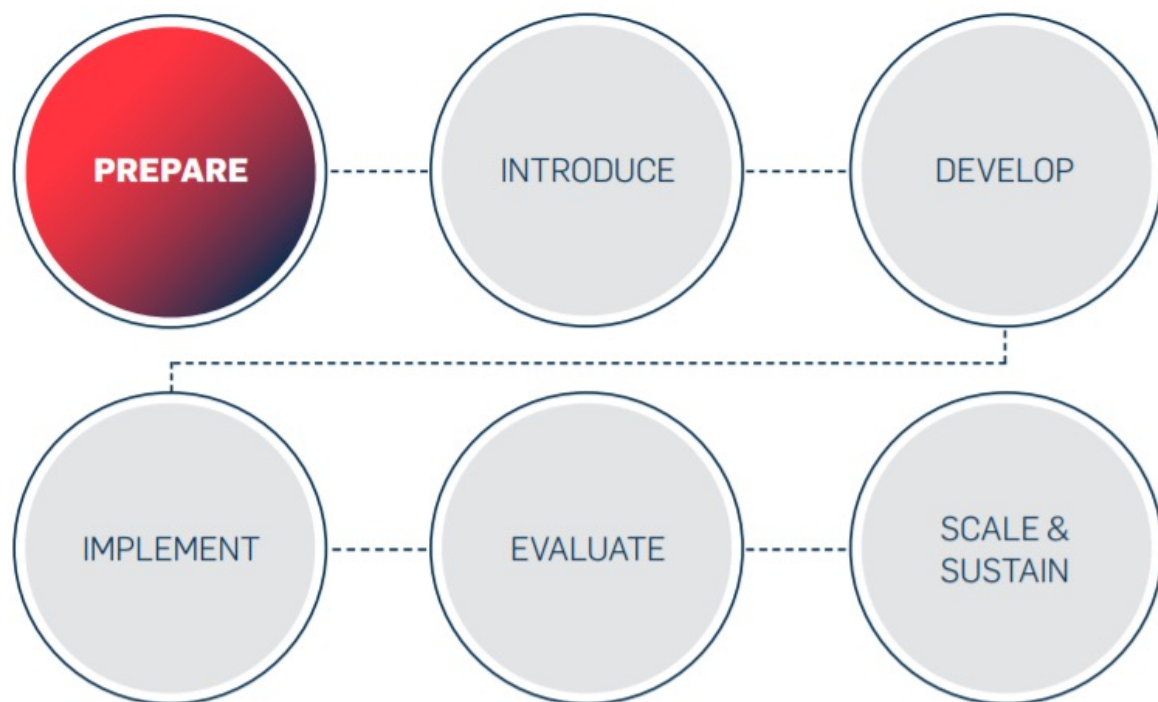


Background on the Anti-Corruption Collective Action Playbook

- This publication was developed as part of the UN Global Compact multi-year project *Scaling up Anti-Corruption Collective Action within Global Compact Local Networks*.
- With the six-step approach and deep dives on key roles throughout the Collective Action process, the Playbook enables readers to make a clear diagnosis of their local corruption landscape, identify and engage stakeholders and apply the Collective Action methodology to address identified corruption challenges and mitigate potential business risks.



THE COLLECTIVE ACTION PROCESS: The BiG SIX



A general six step process with multiple alternatives:

The steps to develop, implement and sustain a Collective Action will vary by type, local context, number and types of stakeholders and identified corruption risks, among other factors.

Nevertheless, a general sequence can serve as guidance to understand the Collective Action methodology.

While the process framework was developed to enable UN Global Compact Local Networks to initiate and/or facilitate Collective Action initiatives with their business participants, the principles and steps are applicable to other actors engaging in Collective Action.

The framework may be adapted to achieve desired results and impact.
