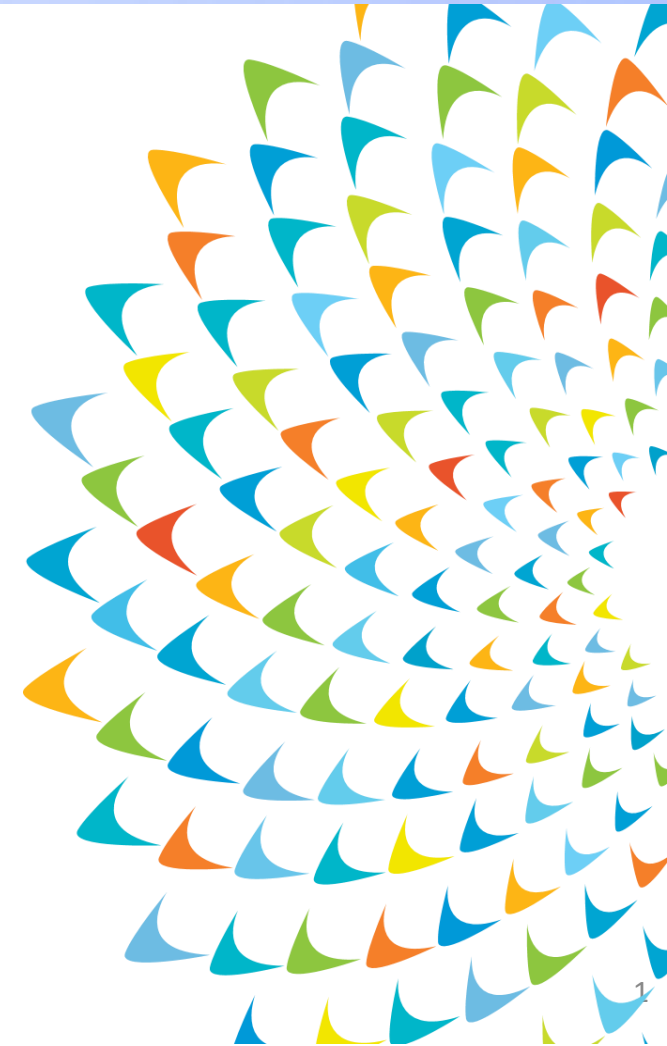

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Rationale:

- Currently across Asia and the Pacific over 70% of pre-mature mortality are attributed to non-communicable diseases (NCDs) – cardiovascular diseases, cancers, chronic respiratory diseases, and diabetes.
- Technology innovations are providing enhanced access and affordability to healthcare services
- Low and middle-income countries can leverage these technologies for management of NCDs. In South Asia, India has had diverse experiences in deploying emerging NCDs technologies.

Objective:

- This session will be an opportunity for exchanging knowledge from South Asia and discuss experiences, lessons, critical barriers and enablers for scale-up in Southeast Asia. The session will focus on prioritizing innovative NCDs technologies for primary health systems.

Regional Technical Assistance: Strengthening Integrated Primary Health Care Management of Noncommunicable Diseases (NCDs) and Mental Health

Technical Assistance (TA) starts in May 2023 and sets out to **improve health and health systems** towards Universal Health Coverage, and reducing the burden of non-communicable Diseases (NCDs) in Asia and the Pacific.

The TA primarily focuses on the role of integrated primary healthcare in managing NCDs, with additional exploratory scope extended to address mental health.
