1 Introduction of Public Procurement Service

Leader in strategic policy implementation for an annual public procurement market of 200T KRW (148B USD), 570,000 suppliers, and 70,000 end-users



A friend to small and medium-sized venture innovators, a strong ladder for growth through back-to-basics public financing

Goods, services and construction contracts

- Procurement and supply of goods (services) and public facilities required by public institutions
- √ 37T KRW (27B USD) in goods and services, 14T KRW (10B USD) in facility construction in 2023

Stockpiling raw materials

- Timely stockpiling and release of major raw materials such as aluminum to stabilize domestic supply and demand for raw materials
- ✓ 700B KRW (51k USD) in 2023

Management of government goods state-owned property

- Managing nearly 23T KRW (17B USD) (16 million items) worth of governmentowned goods
- State-owned property management to improve utilization of state-owned property

KONEPS operation and management

 Serving as a single point of contact for public eprocurement through the Korea ON-line
 E-Procurement System (KONEPS), used by 69,000 public organizations and 569,000 suppliers



Introduction

- The government serving as the first buyer of innovative products, driving innovative growth and improving the quality of public services, including technological innovation and greater market access.
- Basis: 「Government Procurement Act」 Article 27, 「Enforcement Decree of the Act On Contracts To Which The State Is A Party」 Article 26

- Maximize business effectiveness by improving the identification, purchase, and after-sales management of innovative products
 - Identify strategic demand areas and products for public convenience, establish a comprehensive plan for pilot purchase of innovative products, and check qualification maintenance
- Support innovative products' export through overseas demonstration and expansion of ODA projects
 - Significantly expand overseas demonstration projects and link ODA projects with overseas expansion of innovative procurement companies

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05 Priorities | Excellent Product

Select and supply products with excellent quality

Excellent Product



(Introduced in) 1996 (Size of Supply) 4.7T KRW(3.4B USD) (No. of Products) 6,080

Introduction

- A system to support public sales of products with outstanding technology, quality, and performance manufactured by SMEs and drive technological development
- Basis: 「Government Procurement Act」 Article 26, 「Enforcement Decree Of The Act On Contracts To Which The State Is A Party」 Article 26

- Improve contract system to strengthen the technical capabilities of excellent procurements
 - Introduce a technology history system and set new metrics for tech utilization, usability, etc.
- Ease the burden of Excellent Government Procurement Products companies by helping crisis recovery
 - Extend support period for production disruptions due to natural disasters, raw material shortages, etc.

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05 Priorities | Multiple Award Schedule (MAS)

End-users select and purchase from various similar products

Multiple Award Schedule (MAS)



(Introduced in) 2005 (Size of Supply) 18.3T won(13.5B USD) (No. of companies) 11,647

(2023)

Introduction

- Entering into unit price contracts for products of equal or similar quality, performance, efficiency, etc. for products required by multiple end-users.
- A contract system that allows end-users to freely select and purchase by registering on KONEPS shopping mall.
- Basis: 「Government Procurement Act」 Article 13

- Ease the burden on MAS contractors
 - Exempt Disadvantaged Business Enterprises from submitting performance data
- Accelerate site regulatory mitigation for suppliers
 - Reduce regulations such as suspension of sales, interim inspections, and changes to delivery requirements

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05 Priorities | Stockpile

Stabilize domestic supply of key commodities such as raw materials

Stockpile



(Introduced in) 1967 (Size of Supply) 700B KRW (505M USD)

Introduction

- The government directly purchases and reserves raw materials, daily necessities, etc. for short- and long-term supply and price stabilization.
- Basis: 「Government Procurement Act」 Article 13

- Preempt supply chain crises by bolstering raw material stockpiles
 - Increase stockpiles of non-ferrous metals* (6 types) and economic security items**
 - * Aluminum, copper, zinc, lead, tin, nickel
 - ** Urea, activated carbon, calcium chloride, fluorite
 - Expand stockpile infrastructure, build new and modernized stockpile bases and diversify stockpile methods to enhance medium- to long-term stockpile capacity

1 Regulatory Reform in Procurement





Objective

✓ A vigorous regulatory reform to create a better place to do business

Features and Benefits

- ✓ Drastic changes to key regulations that require fundamental changes to the system (Uniform application of unfair regulations, newcomer assessment, etc.)
- Accelerate on-site regulatory mitigation for suppliers (double paperwork, redundant procedures, etc.)

- ✓ By the end of 2023, 179 out of 206 found issues resolved (138 in '22 and 68 in '23) (86.8% fulfillment rate)
- \checkmark Establishment of the "Voice of Site Responsibility Implementation TF" to track regulatory reform + α to the end (Feb. 2024)
- ✓ Identified 53 issues through Thorough Survey of Procurement Regulation in H1 2024

Objective

✓ Actively identify companies that want to participate in public procurement and provide one-stop consulting services from experts for the entire market process (venture ⇒ innovation ⇒ excellence ⇒ MAS ⇒ G-PASS company)

Features and Benefits

- Helping excellent tech companies access public procurement Full-scale consultation via visit, phone, and email
- ✓ Providing consulting and information for novice suppliers
- Customized consulting for company needs

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03 Enhanced Response to Breaches of Competitive Minimum Fair Prices(CMFPs)

Objective

✓ Reinforced response to violations of the obligation to maintain minimum fair prices for products registered on KONEPS Shopping Mall, which requires procurement contract prices to be kept equal to or lower than market prices



Features and Benefits

- Strengthening investigations and penalties to stop MAS contract prices from being higher than the reference price
- Securing fairness and transparency in the public procurement market
 (Investigation of complaints) Maximize available manpower, expedite
 investigations, and increase rewards for complainants
 (Response to violation) Exempt from the debarment period reduction rule in
 cases where the supplier is at fault

(Price checks) Up to three price checks per year for 66 products and 6,261 specifications, and checks for violations of same or similar specifications (Improved education) Enhance mandatory basic training for entering MAS contracts, and establish training on unfair practices and penalties for violations

- Ensure fairness and transparency in public procurement markets by sending clear signals to the market through strict responses to violations
- ✓ Build a public procurement market that is faithful to principles and basic order.



- ✓ (Innovation Demand and Supply Community) Public institutional demand for innovation and innovative products → Public service improvement
- ✓ (R&D Demand Survey Integration) Scattered R&D projects by ministries
 → Provide integrated demand survey window
- ✓ (Supporting the system informatization) New innovation procurement system
 → Convenient and fast online access

- ✓ Significant increase in the number of annual users (160,000 in '22 → 1.2 million in '23)
- √ 1,858 innovative products registered and 273B KRW(200M USD) in cumulative pilot purchases



Venture Mall Performance in 2023



Definition

Dedicated mall for preemptive purchases of leading tech startups' and ventures' products to help them enter new markets and build a foundation for growth

Features and Benefits

- Entry into the procurement market based on technology and quality alone, without past performance or business status score(e.g. credit rating)
- ✓ Deliveries to public institutions (estimated price less than 20M KRW, 15k USD) through direct orders from the end-users without a separate contract process with PPS for up to 5 years after Venture Mall registration

- ✓ Launched in October 2016, Venture Mall has grown to a marketplace with 3,223 companies, 22,744 products, and 587B KRW(434M USD) in cumulative transactions.
- ✓ Venture Mall's sales performance serves as a stepping stone for growth; a total of 460 companies have entered the larger markets of Innovative Products (223 companies), Excellent Products (81 companies), and MAS (123 companies), etc.

01 3 Digital Service Mall

Definition

✓ A shopping mall built to conveniently purchase related products in one place to introduce new IT technologies such as cloud, artificial intelligence, and commercial SW to the public market and expand their demand.



Registered products 5,800

Sales performance 1.97T KRW 1.4B USD



Features and Benefits

- ✓ (Comprehensive IT shopping mall) Concentrates IT technology-related products such as digital services on one site and provides various contract methods such as catalog contracts and third-party unit price contracts (optional)
- ✓ (End-user convenience) Provide conveniences such as digitization for thirdparty unit price contracts (online technology negotiation), products of interest through My Page, and FAQs.
- ✓ (Supplier convenience) Provide IT bidding information service that summarizes pre-specifications and announcements related to IT goods and services in connection with KONEPS

Definition

An integrated system for recruiting and managing evaluators for procurement evaluations, automated negotiation, and external offer

Features and Benefits

- √ (Fairness↑) Establishment of a 'triple management system for evaluators'
 (Evaluator History Management System, Evaluator Monitoring Group, Evaluator
 Reporting Center)
- ✓ (Expertise ↑) Diverse and flexible evaluation categories, provision of negotiation conditions, and constant supervision of evaluator qualifications
- ✓ (Convenience ↑) Provide mobile system for evaluators and external system for end-users

- √ 7,300 active evaluators (3,637 negotiations and 25,838 negotiators in 2023)
- Providing PPS evaluators to other organizations (394 organizations, 1,194 negotiations, 8,358 negotiators as of the end of 2023)
- Expanded joint utilization of evaluators with central administrative agencies and public institutions
- Statistics Korea, Postal Business Procurement Center, SR, etc.

Definition

✓ An online system for the entire procurement process, from proposal request and proposal to evaluation.

Features and Benefits

- √ (Online Proposal Submission) Proposals and other materials submitted by suppliers online (no need to visit)
- ✓ (Online evaluation site) For proposal evaluation, evaluators and suppliers can participate online without the need to travel to the evaluation site
- ✓ (Convenience features) Al-based RFP writing and diagnostic tools, electronic document linkage, and proposal tables provide convenience for suppliers and evaluation committee members

- ✓ Reduced procurement and order costs* by creating an online evaluation culture * RFP writing costs, evaluation fees, travel expenses, proposal printing, etc.
- Expanding online evaluations to increase available evaluators and their expertise
- ✓ Improved productivity by providing AI-based RFP writing and diagnosis tools * Submitted to the OECD Public Governance Committee (PGC) for the Best Practice Competition

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03 ② Contract Performance Verification System

Definition

A system monitoring, controlling and investigating unfair practices in public procurement market

Features and Benefits

- ✓ (Monitoring direct production violations) Using information linked to employment and electricity consumption
- ✓ (Monitoring price inflation) Utilizing the National Tax Service's electronic tax invoice information
- ✓ (Preventing forgery of test reports and certificates) Linking test report and certificate information with G4B

Achievements

✓ Identified 264 companies in the last three years for unfair procurement practices, including direct production violations, non-compliant deliveries, and violations of country of origin.
