



Advice when approaching Opportunities

Plan ahead: Identify a pipeline of projects of interest. Understand project background, local context & partnership needs

Respond clearly to qualification and evaluation criteria Be aware of borrower systems for advertising and submission of Bids

Build local partnerships (JV or association)

Carefully read & understand submission requirements; no conditional bids

Understand legal
& regulatory
systems
(business
registration, tax,
customs etc.)







Common Mistakes

Bids not signed, or unclear authorization to sign

Ownership structures and JV arrangements

No compliant Bid Security / Bid Securing Declaration

Failure to meet Qualification Criteria

Poor Supporting Documents

Incomplete Bids / Partial Bids

Inclusion of financial offer with technical offer where bid conditions require them to be separated







