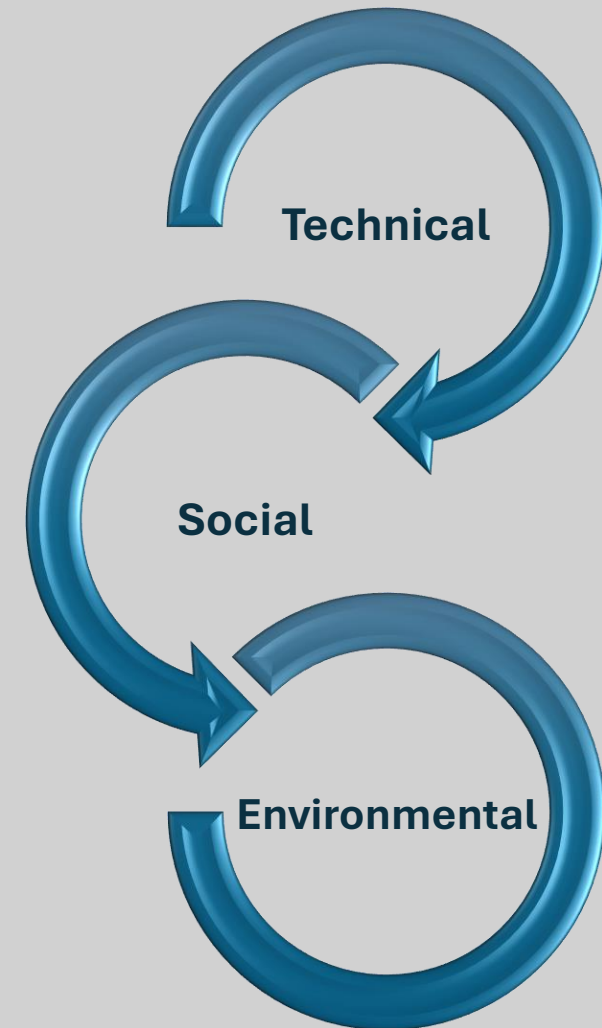

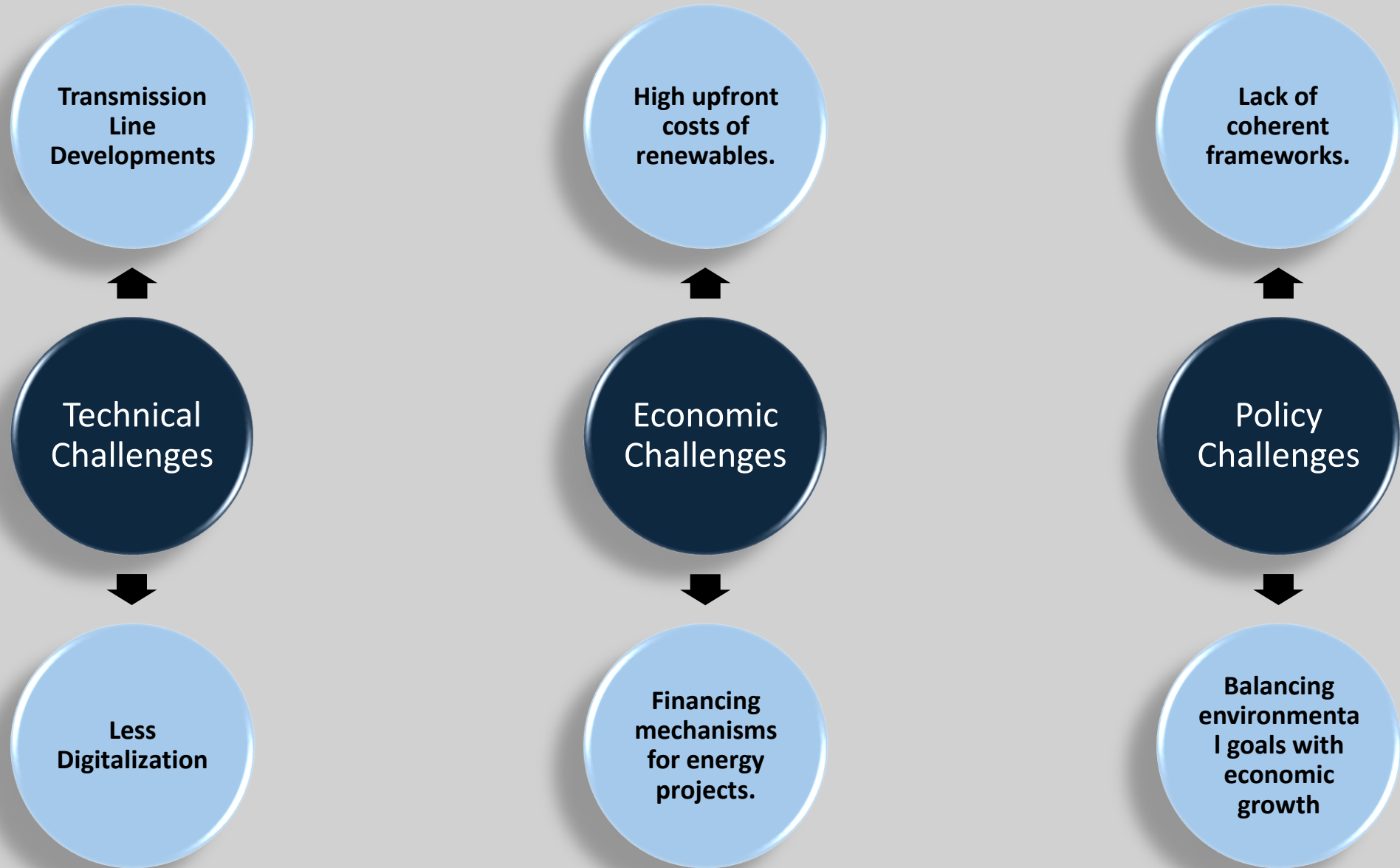


WHY A PEOPLE-CENTRIC ENERGY TRANSITION?

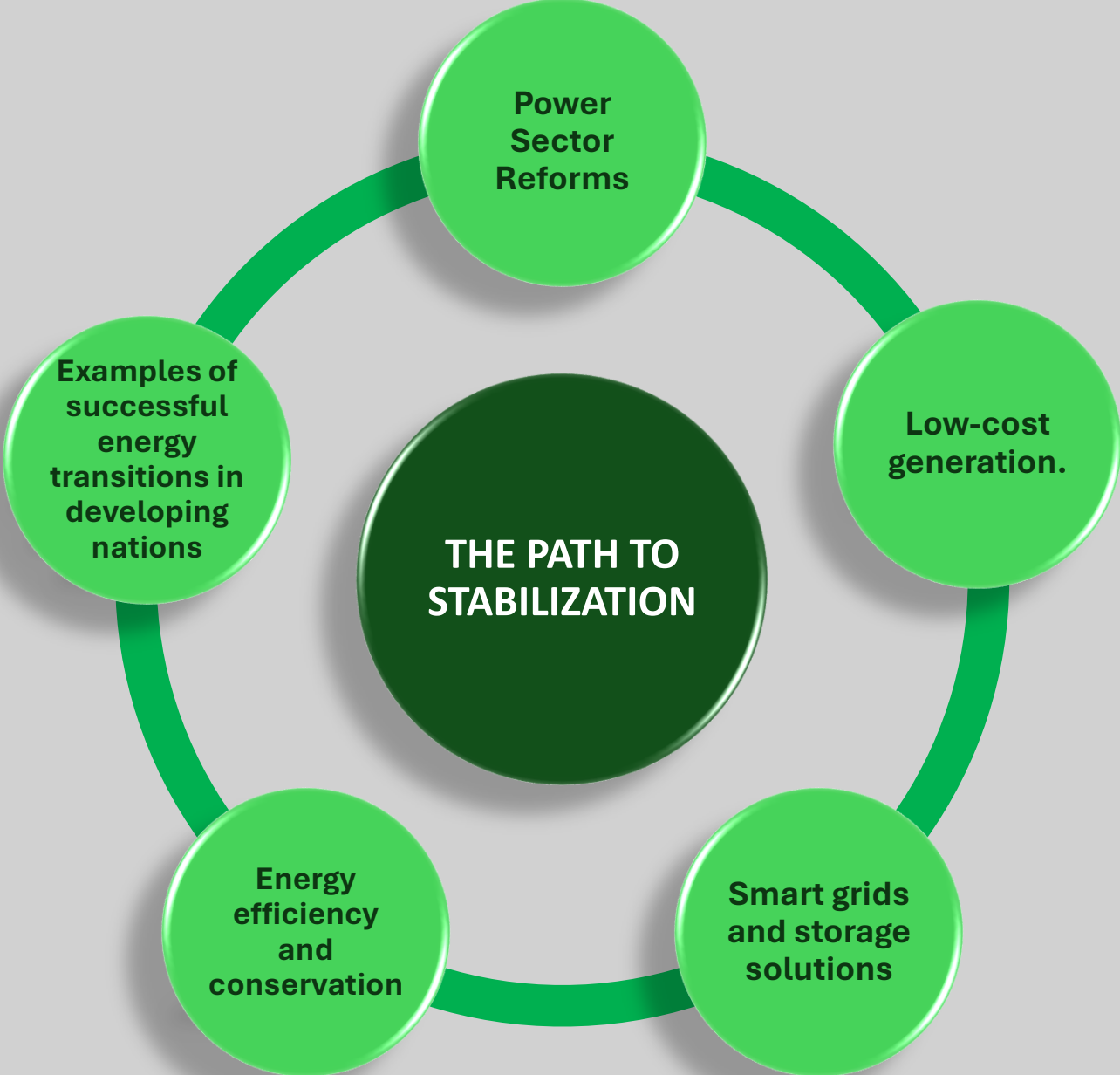
- **Accessibility:** Ensuring energy reaches marginalized and underserved communities.
