Georgia – Connecting Economies

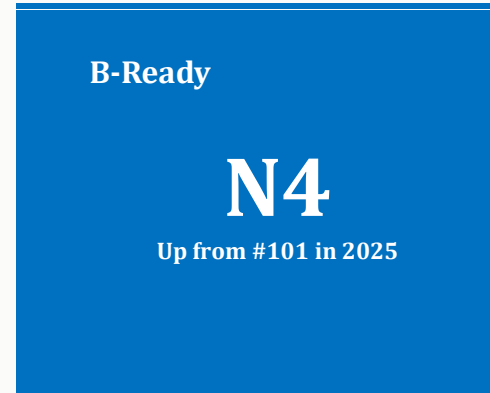


- Bridge connecting several important economic regions including the EU, South Caucasus, and Central Asia

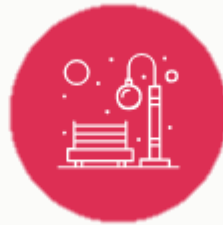

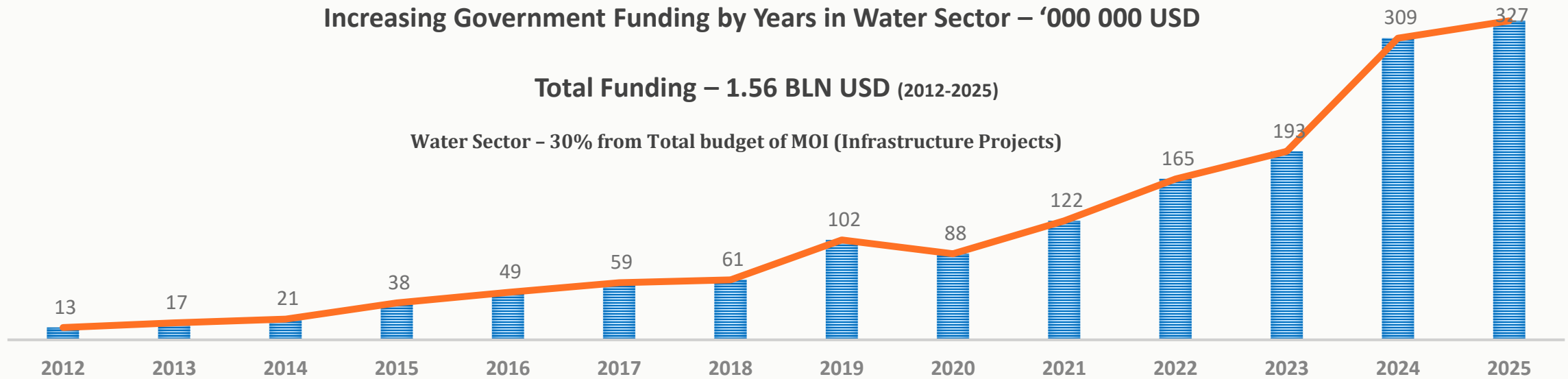

Total Funding – 1.56 BLN USD (2012-2025)

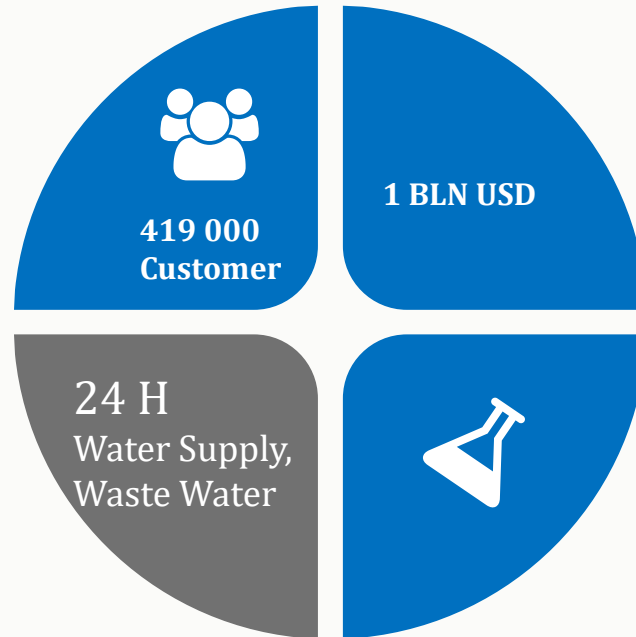

Pollution of water sources due to industrial and agricultural activities

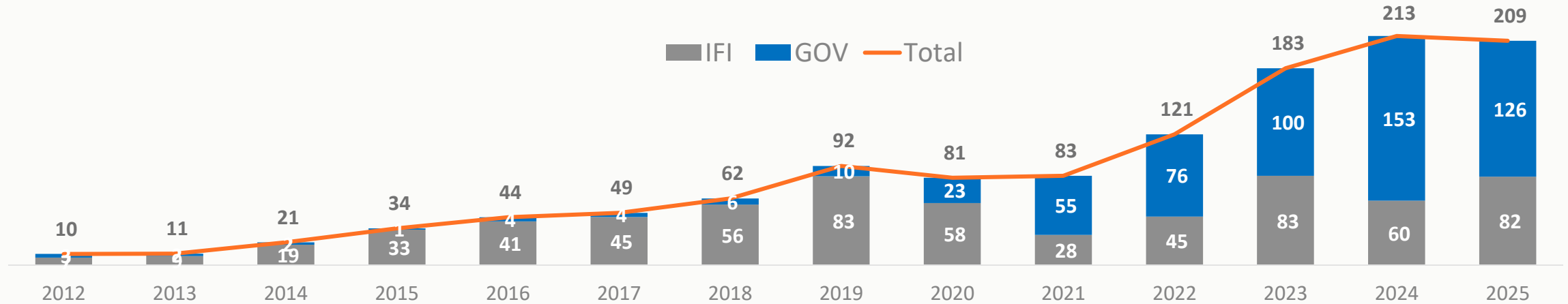

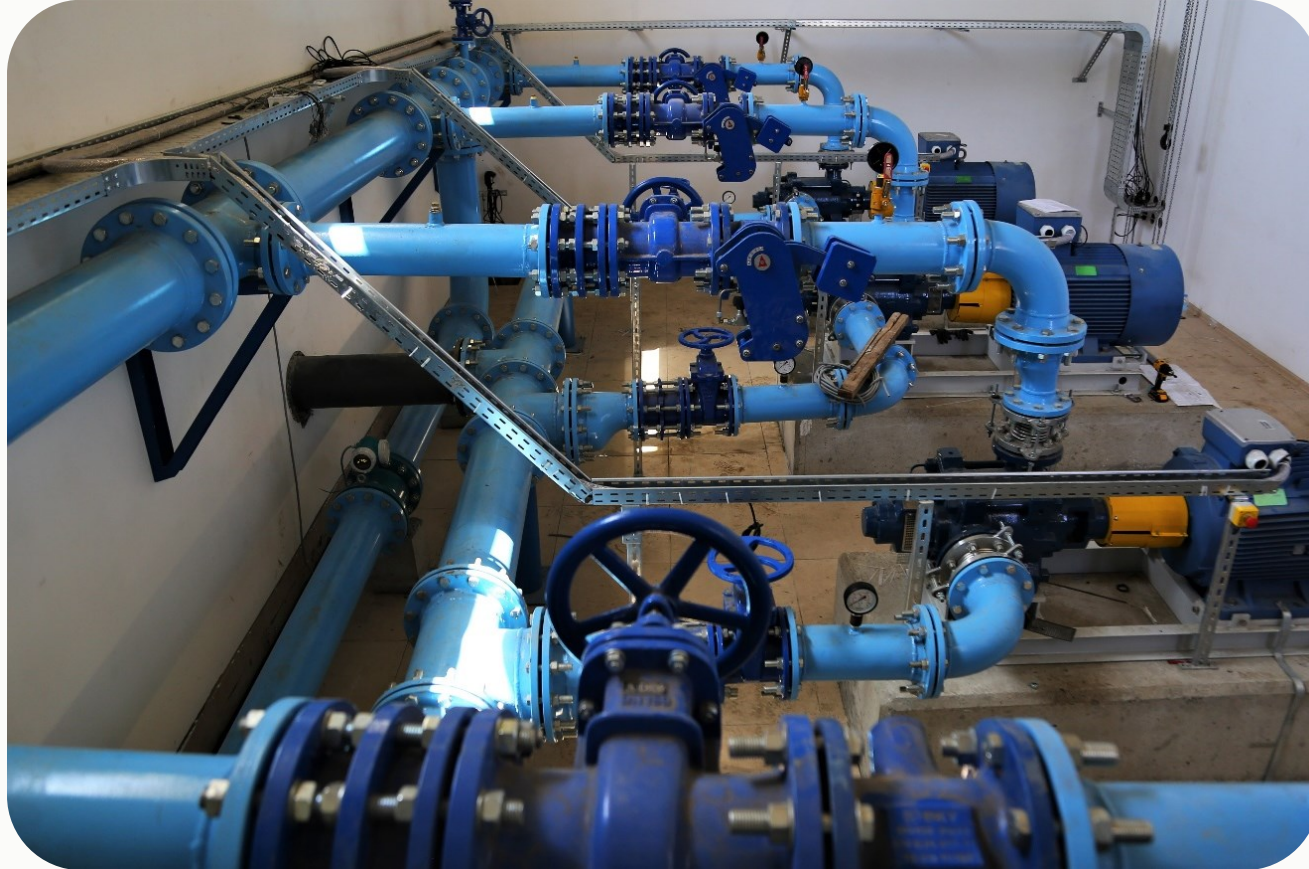

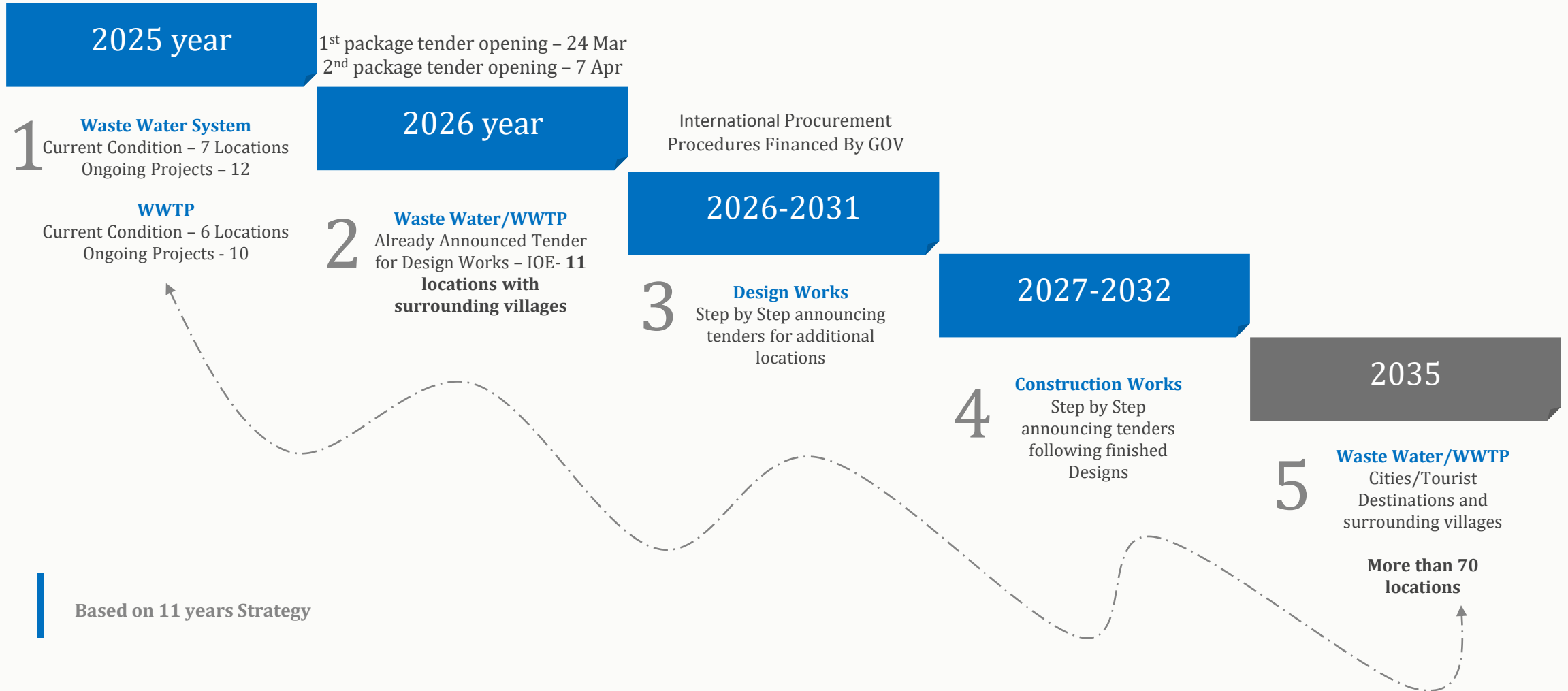
