

Protecting Vulnerable Communities



- WFP **supports vulnerable communities** through early warning information, Anticipatory Action (AA), insurance, livelihood support to **build resilience against shocks.**
- WFP focuses on providing **technical assistance, capacity strengthening** to help governments deliver more inclusive, shock responsive, and **climate informed social protection systems and programmes.**

Building resilience of vulnerable Communities



Linking AA and Social Protection (SP) System



- Embed **AA triggers, protocols, and financing** into national social protection and disaster management systems ([Fiji](#)) or utilize social protection (SP) database to identify and reach the AA beneficiaries ([Philippines](#)).
- Allows households to receive **early cash support before a climate shock** (e.g., flood, tropical storms, drought) hits, reducing losses, protecting assets, and strengthening livelihood resilience.

Bangladesh – Livelihood support in *Char*



**Pumpkin fields, Kurigram,
Bangladesh**

- Climate Smart Agriculture for boosting agriculture production in vulnerable contexts (*char - low-lying riverine islands prone to floods*) and enhancing food security.
- Layers of support provided to the communities to protect from climate shocks – early warning messages, anticipatory cash, climate risk insurance, trainings, start-up capital, to build their resilience.

Long Term Government System Strengthening

Institutional and capacity strengthening for livelihood improvement through Shock Responsive Social Protection system.

This includes support for

- Horizontal and vertical coordination across social protection, disaster management, and climate sectors
- Support provision at individual, household, community, institution, and system level for the improvement of livelihood
- digital delivery and payment systems
- national registries policy and legislative frameworks and targeting mechanisms
