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KEY BARRIER

- 1 Extreme Weather which will cause harvest failure and the decrease of crop productivity
- 2 Natural Disaster ie flood, land slide etc will affect the distribution system for market access/marketing. It will cause the fluctuation of some strategies commodity
- 3 Low Productivity and profitability with majority farmers being smallholder



OPPORTUNITIES

- 1 Empowering farmer groups by increasing farmer's institutional capability to have wider market access
- 2 Adopt climate smart technologies : climate smart agriculture, smart farming
- 3 Increasing farmer capacity adapted with climate change

SPECIFIC SOLUTIONS FOR COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

- 1 **Develop and Strengthening of Farmer Economic Institutions**
Strengthening the bargaining power of farmer
- 2 **Value Chain-Based Partnership Development**
Private Sector Engagement (Off taker, Processing Industry)
- 3 **Business Consolidation of Farmer Economic Institution**
Developing business units such as input supply, post-harvest services, packaging, and collective marketing
- 4 **Enhancing Financial Access and Risk Management**
Technical Guidance or Training on accessing formal financing and managing business risks, including price fluctuations, climate, and production



SUSTAINABLE AND BANKABLE

Lesson Learned From These Initiatives that could inform replication or wider scaling

- 1 Focus on transforming livelihoods from subsistence-based to sustainable, market-oriented, and climate-resilient systems
- 2 Establishing Sustainable Farmer-Led Economic Organizations
- 3 Promoting the initiative to increase the awareness of smallholder farmers concerning the advantages of participating in Farmer Economic Institution
- 4 Promoting of commitment to developing Farmer Economic Institution in a sustainable manner
- 5 Transforming farmer group and farmer organization to Farmer Economic Institution which focus on taking benefits and member commitment to long-term sustainability
- 6 Increasing women participation and actively involved women in household financial decision-making

- Emancipatory = Gender Equatibility
- Transparent
- Accountable
- Sustainable



Support needed from government and/or development partners to scale the approach through national systems and programs

- 1 Financial Literacy Education :** Training focus on household (husband and wife). Indikator penekanan keberhasilan pelatihan dan dilakukan evaluasi secara berkala
- 2 Leveraging Local Knowledge:** Integrating traditional farming practices with modern technology to ensure adoption and sustainability.
- 3 Policy Support:** Creating linkages between community-level action and national adaptation plans (NAPs) to ensure long-term, institutional support.
- 4 Networking:** Connecting local cooperatives with wider, regional market actors, allowing for pooled resources and knowledge transfer
- 5 Financial Investment:** Investment funding is allocated to 'prime movers/champion" who establish partnerships with smallholder farmers. These initiatives necessitate consistent coaching and technical assistance.
- 6 Financial Investment:** Directing investment financing toward smallholder farmers necessitates a heightened level of supervision and close administrative support
