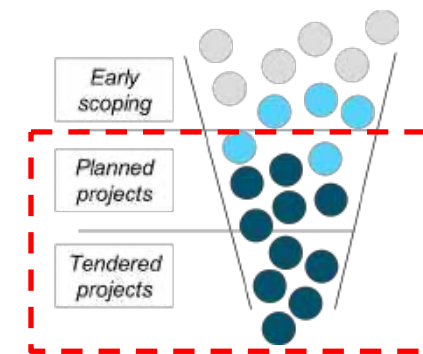

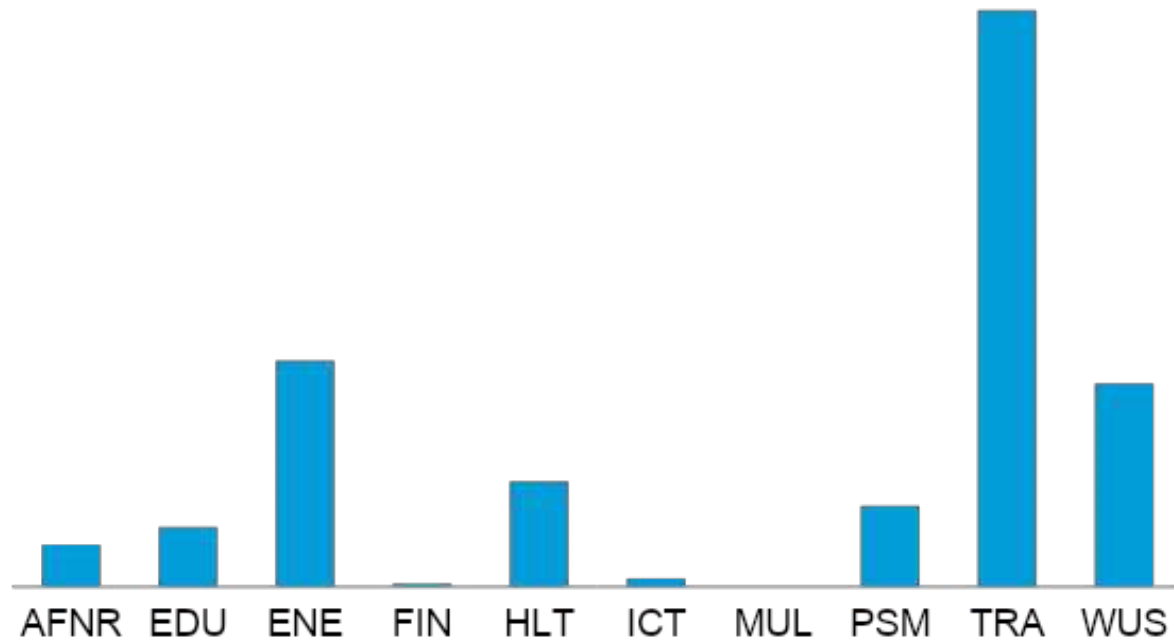


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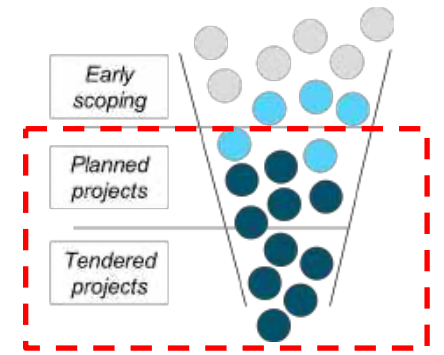


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# ADB Pacific Active Portfolio in Volume by Sector (\$ million)

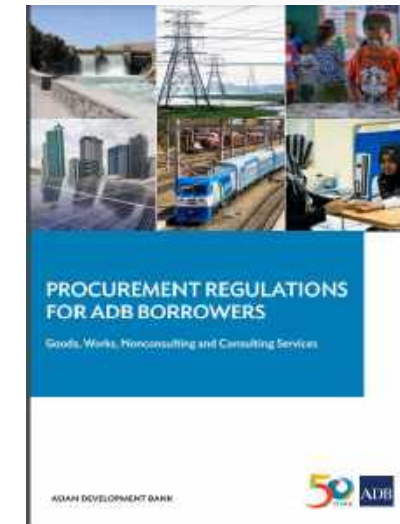
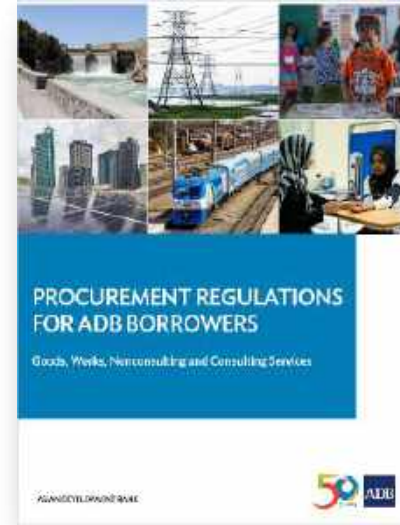

- Quality is prioritized in evaluation using Merit Point Criteria (MPC)
- Increased focus on enhancing local content (local participation) on ADB financed projects.

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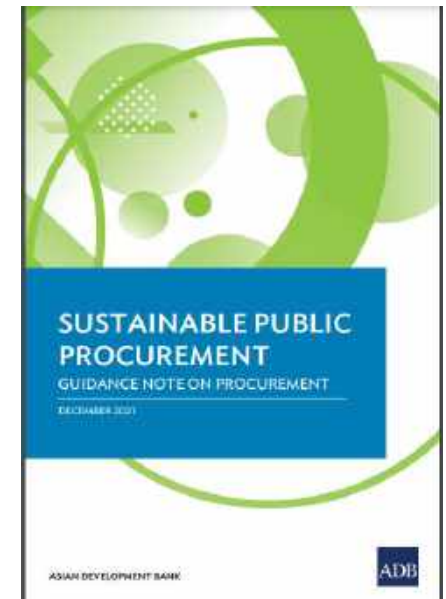
# Development of Procurement Strategy

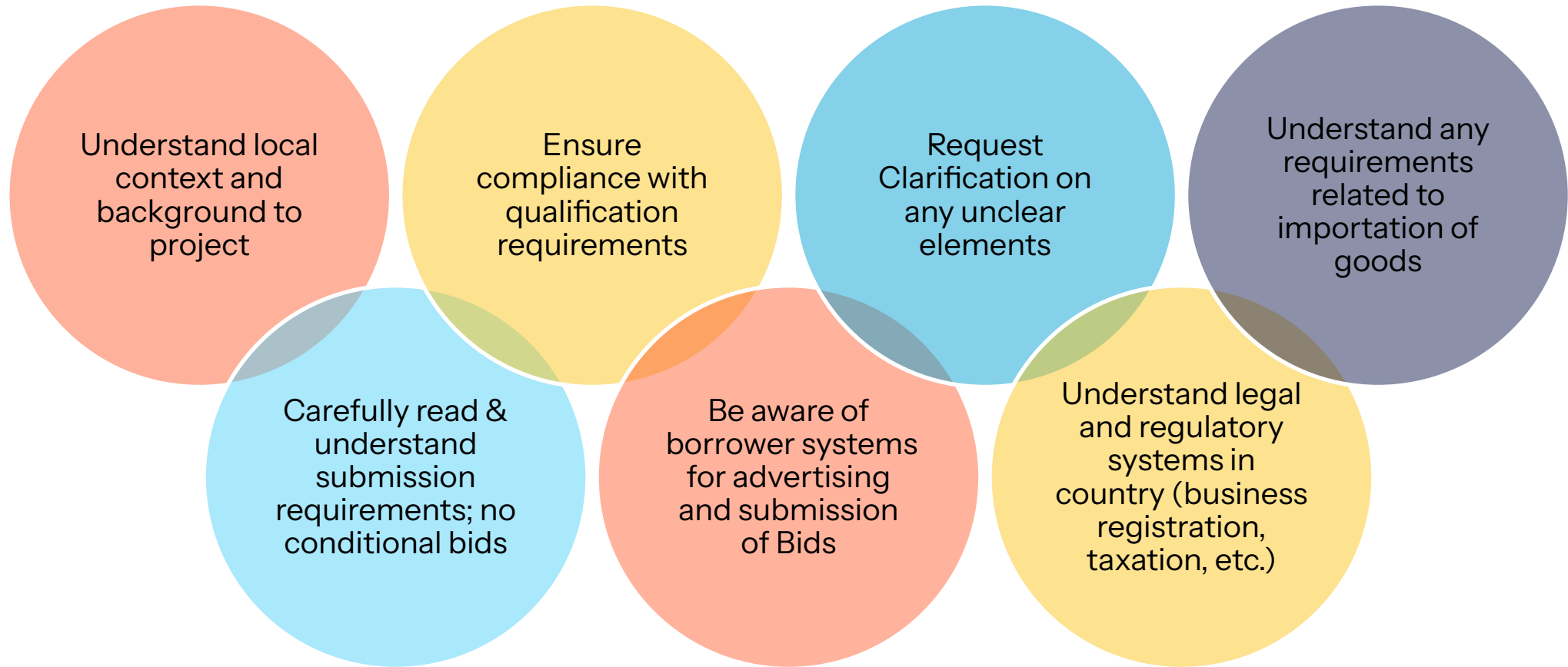
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# Merit Point Criteria and the Pacific Quality Infra Principles

- Since January this year, ADB mandates use of MPC for new internationally advertised civil works contracts in the Pacific.
- This approach aligns with the ADB’s priorities, such as climate resilience, sustainable infrastructure, gender inclusion, and innovation and support PQIP
- As a minimum require to include 10% technical weighting on the local participation
- Skills development activities can be introduced through Build4Skills

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Bids not signed

No Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration (if required)

Insufficient Amount of Bid Security, incorrect validity period

Failure to meet Qualification Criteria

Lack of Supporting Documents

Incomplete Bids / Partial Bids

Absence of test reports if required

Conflicts of interest not disclosed

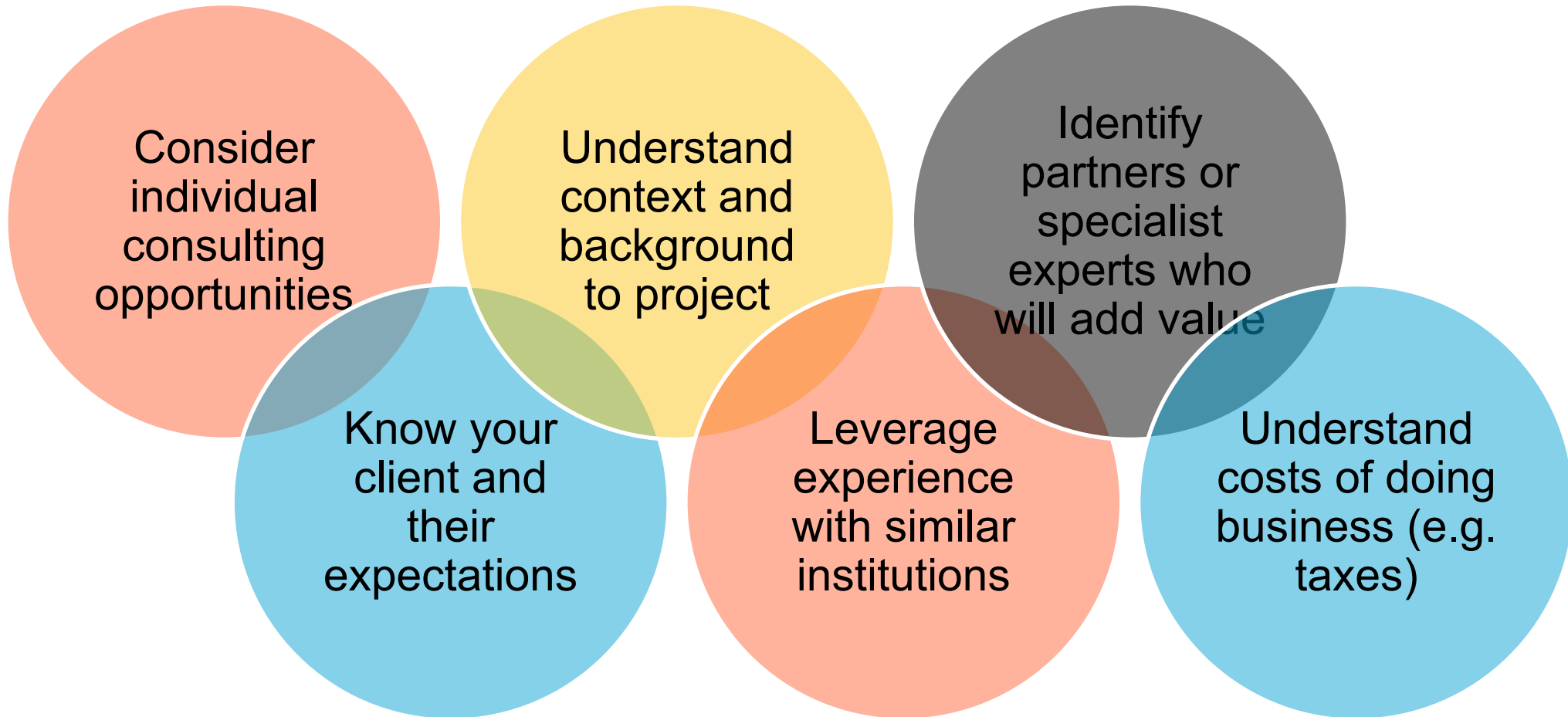

## Shortlisting Phase



- Lack of knowledge of project context
- Incorrect Skills match
- Limited geographic experience
- Generic EOI
- Lack of local presence

## RFP Stage



- Financial info in technical proposal
- Not responsive to ToR
- Not demonstrating strength of firm
- Lack of suitability
- Issues with CMS\*

ADB publishes the names and contact details of firms invited to submit proposals. This is for the information of consultants who wish to associate with them. Interested consultants should contact the firms directly.



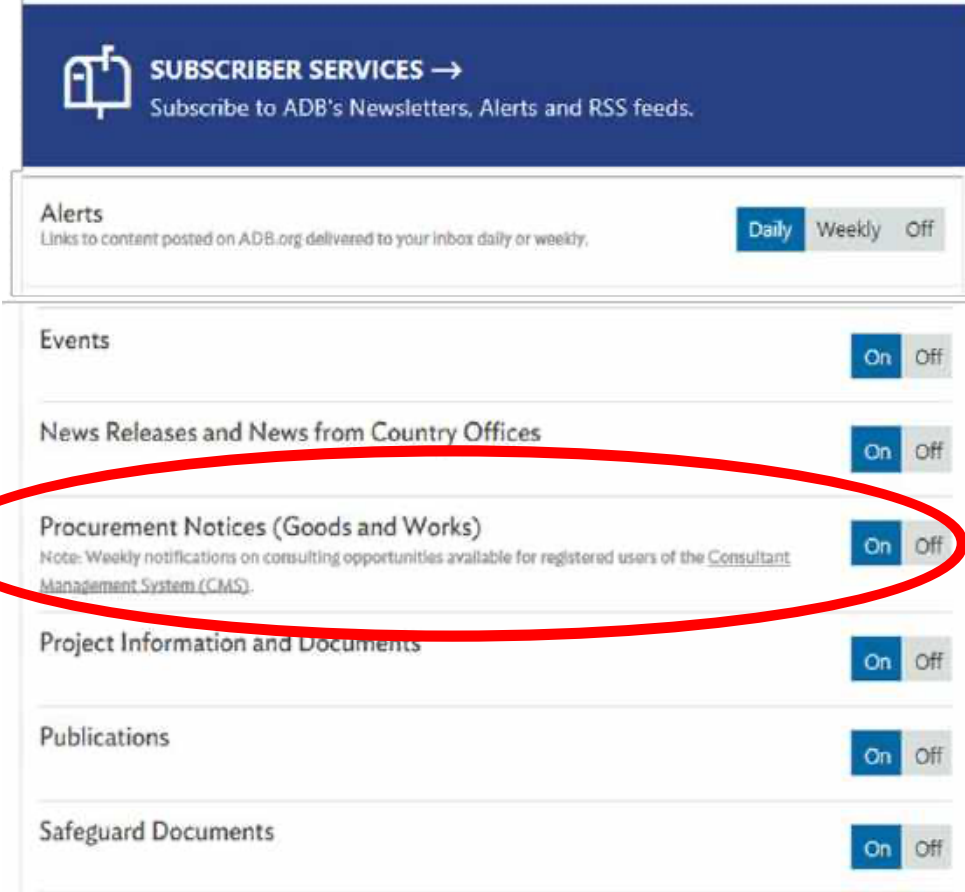
