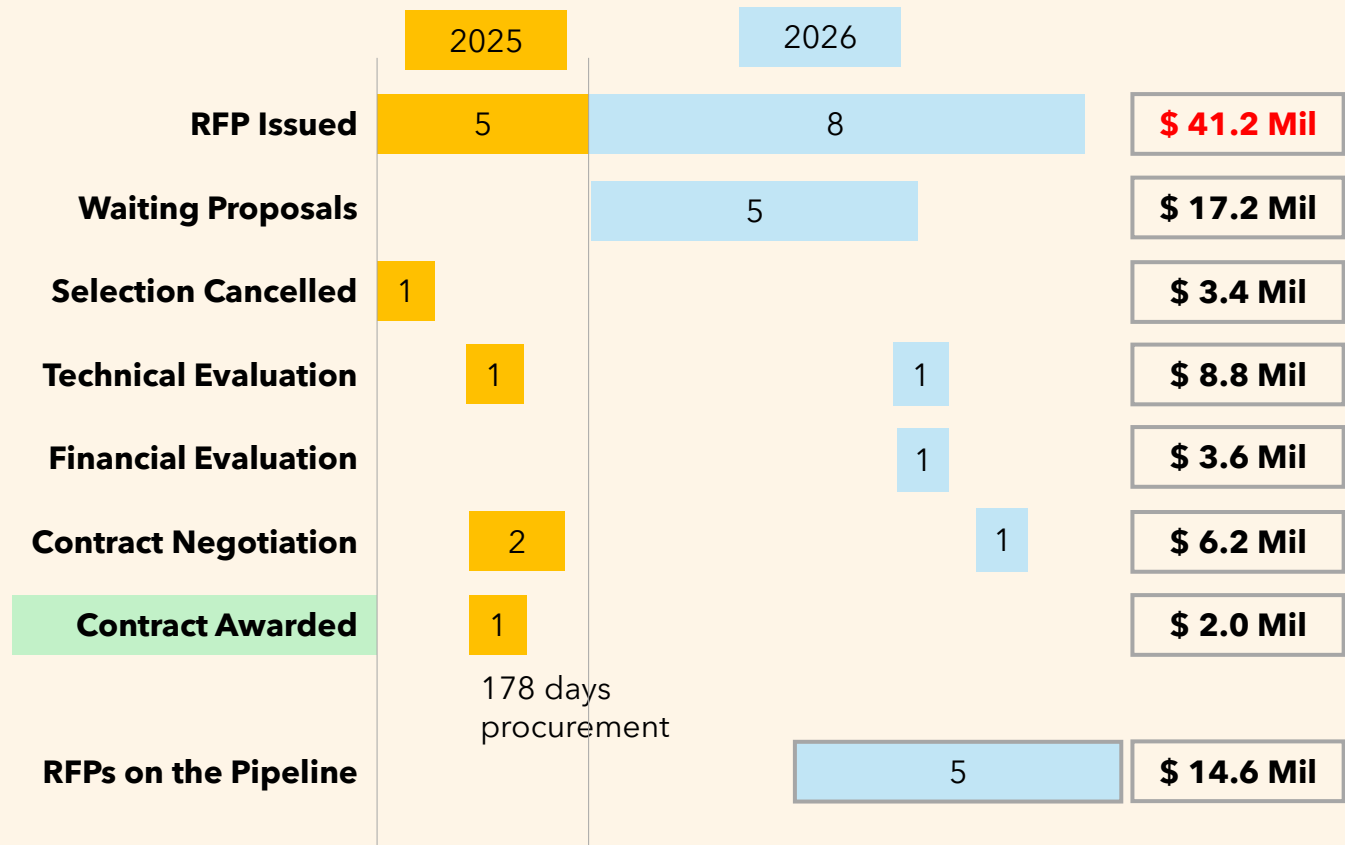

## About the Roster

- **Validity:** June 2025 - June 2028 (extendable by 2 years)
- **Firms:** 46 firms (including JV members)
- **Sectors:** Agriculture, Energy, Social, Transport, Water
- **Assignments:** Detailed Engineering Design (DED) & Construction Supervision Consultancy (CSC)
- **Terms:** Fixed max remuneration rates; mandatory KPIs, Removal of firms for underperformance.

# Lesson Learnt/Feedbacks



Lessons Learnt	Response
Early Engagement <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Limited response time</li> <li>- Parallel requests</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Early engagement with project teams and rostered firms helps align roster coverage with upcoming demand.</li> <li>• Invitation letter/email introduced</li> </ul>
<b>Common non-bid reasons:</b> resource constraints, short timelines, geographic limitations, budget/scope concerns	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ADB/WB noted these however there is no amendments to current roster terms. However seeking participation interest in advance will resolve these issues</li> </ul>

Feedback	Response
No Invitations (Since launch of the Roster: 16 firms received RFPs; 6 firms did not receive any RFPs)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reason for non-receipt of RFPs - due to exclusion of from the invitations Guidance given to project teams that all firms should be invited</li> <li>• Agriculture sector firms - relatively newly established following second round.</li> <li>• No RFPs issued under ENE sector yet.</li> </ul>
The current policy of removing firms after declining to submit proposals three times within a sector could be too restrictive.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Current policy remains unchanged.</li> </ul>
<b>Other feedback:</b> improve pipeline visibility, advance notice, extend timelines, TOR quality, collaboration/cross-teaming	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• TOR templates are introduced <a href="#">Documents for Recruitment of Firms and Individual Consultants by Executing Agencies   Asian Development Bank</a></li> <li>• Advance notice will be issued to the firms to confirm the interest</li> </ul>
