- Strong focus on climate resilience, connectivity, and essential public services
- Priority sectors: transport, utilities, coastal protection, public facilities, and community infrastructure
- Adaptive delivery approaches for remote and outer-island environments
- FSM welcomes partnerships with firms experienced in small-island, remote, and outer-island project delivery
