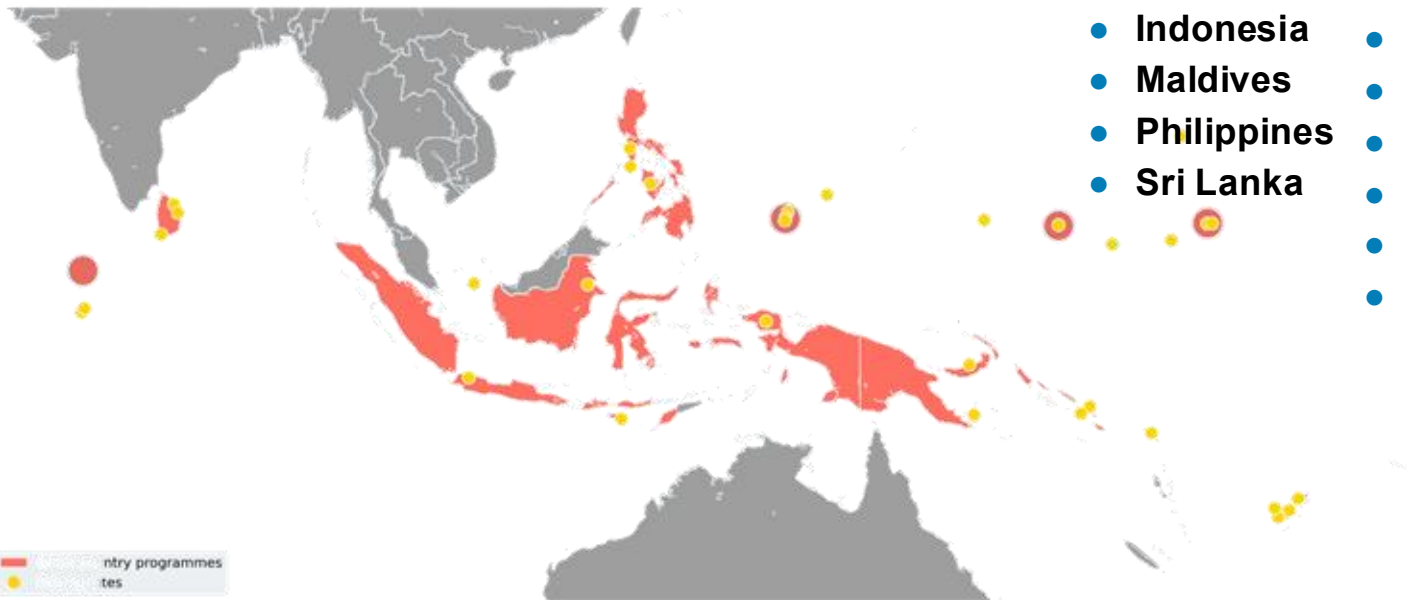

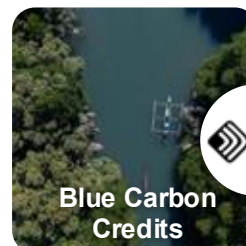

Fiji



Locally Managed Marine Areas

- **Shark Reef Marine Reserve:** \$310K concessional loan for constructing a diving base and research space. Halfway through repayment.
- **Korolevu-i-Wai LMMA:** Project suspended due to lack of community buy-in and project viability.
 - *Credit guarantee to Fiji Development Bank to lend to reef-positive businesses operating in LMMAs proposed as pivot.*

Priority Sites

- Viti-Levu (Greater Suva Area)
- Vanua Levu
- Qoliqoli Cokovata and Qoliqoli Nadogo
- Cuvu Tikina on the Coral Coast
- Shark Reef Marine Reserve – Serua
- Beqa Lagoon and Kuata Marine Protected Areas

Sanitary Landfill

- Cabinet of Ministers agreed to an Open Tender process for a new landfill project costing between **US\$17 and 30 million**.
- Phased approach to landfill development proposed by the Gov, starting with dumpsite rehabilitation into a Material Recycling Facility.
 - **Open tender process to be launched in 2025.** ADB as transaction advisor.
 - *Feasibility study, grant funding for rehabilitation, credit/guarantee for equipment purchase proposed as pivot.*



TA Facility

- Pipeline developed by Matanataki produced 5+ reef-positive businesses.
- Deemed not investment-ready by Convening Agent.
- Matanataki terminated partnership in 2024.

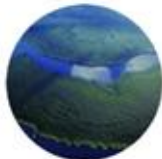
